"Living a Good Life"

What does it mean to live a good life? Solomon writes from the vantage point of an elderly man and offers wisdom on how to live. So, let us consider how to live a good life.

As he looks backwards, he says in Eccl. 1:2-4, "Meaningless! Meaningless! says the teacher. Utterly meaningless. Everything is meaningless. What does man gain from all his labor at which he toils under the sun? Generations come and generations go, but the earth remains forever." He repeats this phrase 24 times. In other words, life is not easy to figure out. It is in fact an enigma. He characterizes life as "chasing after the wind" (Eccl. 1:14). We try to get a hold of it but we cannot, which explains why he thinks life is meaningless.

People have tried to find meaning in life through various avenues. Some look to knowledge and sage wisdom. Some people seek pleasure as a way of life—laughter, wine, self-indulgence. That too is meaningless. Some seek achievements—working hard and making money—as a way of life. But at the end of the day, these will get us nowhere. No matter how hard we try, we have no control over our lives. This kind of scepticism is what Solomon calls life "under the sun". It sounds pessimistic because it looks at life in this world without reference to God. Deep down, we have this vacuum in our hearts, a desire to know how everything fits together (Eccl. 3:11). But we lack God's eye point of view on the world. We are not God. But this is not the sum total of Solomon's message. The preacher is not a pessimist. He does not despair over the emptiness of life.

Where do we find joy and meaning in life? The wisdom writer is appealing to us to seek God. "Now all has been heard; here is the conclusion of the matter: Fear God and keep his commandments, for this is the whole duty of man. For God will bring every deed to judgment, including every hidden thing, whether it is good or evil" (Eccl. 12:13-14). Only then will we be able to experience true joy, in spite of the challenges of life. The meaning of life is found in God, who is in control, even though we may not always understand his ways.

Our joy comes from the belief that life is a gift from God (read Eccl. 2:24-26). It's not that Christians are exempted from suffering. It is possible to live with joy and meaning in spite of the injustices, contradictions, uncertainties, and all the disappointments. The message of Ecclesiastes isn't that earthly joys are worthless, but that they are not ultimate. When we recognize that no earthly goods are ultimate—our careers, achievements, and possessions—we can stop treating them like they are. When we own the fact that death will take everything from us, we are free to enjoy the small things in life for what they are.





NOMINATION & ELECTION OF ELDERS AND DEACONS

Session is calling for ECM - Election of Elders and Deacons to be held on **Sunday, 13 November 2022**. Those elected will serve a three-year term from 1 January 2023.

ORPC members are entitled to nominate other ORPC members who have been serving faithfully in ORPC and demonstrated leadership qualities, for election as Elders or Deacons.

The closing date for nominations is **Sunday, 2 October 2022**.

Session will interview all candidates with their spouses (if any). Those who qualify and are deemed to be suitable nominees will be recommended and announced to the congregation on three Sundays (23, 30 Oct and 6 Nov 2022) prior to the election date.

To be duly elected, candidates must receive at least (a) two-thirds of the votes cast for Elders and (b) half of the votes cast for Deacons.

WHAT DO ELDERS AND DEACONS DO?

Elders and Deacons are voluntary office bearers in the Congregation. They join the pastoral staff in pastoral leadership and oversight, oversee the management of ORPC, assist in the administration of ORPC and in all matters concerning the building-up and growth of ORPC.

Elders serve primarily in Session and may also be appointed to the Board of Management (BoM). Session is the final decision-making body in ORPC and has particular responsibility for the spiritual mission and care of ORPC.

Deacons serve in the BoM and have particular responsibility for the physical care of God's people and for managing the material resources of ORPC to serve its spiritual mission.

WHO CAN BE NOMINATED AND ELECTED?

- Elders and Deacons must meet the biblical qualifications according to 1 Timothy 3:1-13 and Titus 1:6-9.
- Nominees must be communicant members of ORPC for more than three years.
- All nominees are expected to have served in at least one area of ministry in ORPC for a minimum period of one year prior to being nominated.
- Elders must have served for at least one term of three years as a Deacon.
- Spouses of Elders and Deacons must also be communicant members of ORPC. Divorcees and those with previously-divorced spouses do not qualify for nomination.

- Elders and Deacons must assent to the basic creeds and confessions of the Presbyterian Church, the Apostles' Creed, the Westminster Confession of Faith, the Constitution of the Synod of the Presbyterian Church in Singapore and the Constitution of ORPC.
- Elders and Deacons must attend regular Session/BoM meetings, congregational monthly prayer meetings, ministry/committee meetings as assigned, leaders' retreats, annual and extraordinary congregational meetings. They must also share in pastoral visitation and undertake other duties relevant to their office and other assigned responsibilities as decided from time to time.


HOW TO NOMINATE?


Elders and Deacons must be proposed and seconded by other communicant members of ORPC.

A member who wants to nominate another member should first check the eligibility of that other member (please see above) before making any nomination.

The proposer needs a seconder for the nomination. After both the proposer and the seconder have signed the nomination form, the nominee must sign the form to confirm his/her consent to the nomination.


