Hello, My Name Is...

Hospitality is one of the things that we find most challenging as a society. It's somehow really ingrained in us to leave others alone unless they ask to be approached. And in church, that means that we are content to sit in the same area as the same people for many years without ever knowing their names, without ever introducing ourselves, thinking that "well, if they want to make friends, they'll come over and say hi" and all the while they are thinking the exact same thing of us. And it means that when we see someone new in church, we think "oh let's not overwhelm this new person, he'll fill out the welcome card if he wants to be spoken to"... and as a newcomer to church myself in the past, both in ORPC and in PSPC where I spent one year on field education, I absolutely hated having to raise my hand and have all eyes on me, and it felt like a momentous decision to fill out that welcome card. And it means that we find it hard to invite people to our homes, even people we've known for many years in church, preferring to hold our meetings (whether business or fellowship) in church, a sort of neutral ground, instead of inviting people into our homes. Inviting people into our homes feels like the last bastion of privacy has been breached, and all the messy details of our lives are now open for the whole world to see.

The thing is, hospitality is hard. But that is also precisely why it is important for the church. Because hospitality is countercultural, it's not natural to us in today's society, and that means that this is one way in which the church's love for each other and for the community around them is highlighted and displayed. We were once all strangers in the church, even if we were born to parents in the church – but we now belong because people have welcomed us and made us at home, because people have loved us as they have loved themselves (Mark 12:31, Matt 22:39). And I can't think of any better way to show love to others than by opening our lives, our hearts, and our homes to them. By serving others, we serve Christ (Matt 22:40), and Christ commanded us to love each other (John 13:34-35) and to practice hospitality (Rom 12:13, 1 Pet 4:9).

But as with any new habit, we start with baby steps. And baby steps in this case means just looking out for one new face every month (not necessarily new to the church, just new to you!) and making it a point to say hi, to introduce yourself, to get the other person's name, and to intentionally look out for the other person over the next few weeks, maybe even going out for coffee after service if you can. This is within everyone's ability. Do this with a friend, then you won't have to carry the conversation alone. And keep doing it. It's fine if you get rejected, it's fine if people run away from you, it's fine if you can't find the person the next few weeks. What matters is that you try, what matters is that you practice the habit of hospitality.

Shall we try it together? We start with "hello, my name is..."

Two (2) representatives from English Presbytery will be present to supervise and witness the process. The Chairman of the ECM will be informed of the final tally of the votes, which will be announced at the ECM.

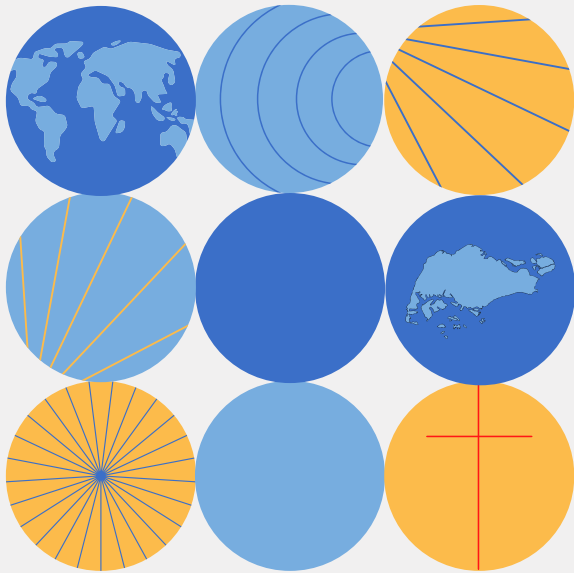

BIBLICAL THEOLOGY OF THE PEOPLE OF GOD

Why is the People of God one of the most significant and comprehensive biblical teachings in the Bible?

With its roots going back to the creation narrative, this doctrine takes form in the calling of Abraham and becomes the central focus of Old Testament history. That calling of Abraham included the promise of blessing for all nations (Gen 12:3). But the nation of Israel, as God's people, suffered judgment. Christ came to fulfil God's promises to Abraham and thus reconstitute God's people from all the nations of the earth.

In this session, we will consider some of the spiritual benefits and practical implications of being the People of God.

NOMINATION & ELECTION OF ELDERS AND DEACONS

Session is calling for ECM - Election of Elders and Deacons to be held on **Sunday, 13 November 2022**. Those elected will serve a three-year term from 1 January 2023.

ORPC members are entitled to nominate other ORPC members who have been serving faithfully in ORPC and demonstrated leadership qualities, for election as Elders or Deacons.

The closing date for nominations is **Sunday, 2 October 2022**.

Session will interview all candidates with their spouses (if any). Those who qualify and are deemed to be suitable nominees will be recommended and announced to the congregation on three Sundays (23, 30 Oct and 6 Nov 2022) prior to the election date.

To be duly elected, candidates must receive at least (a) two-thirds of the votes cast for Elders and (b) half of the votes cast for Deacons.

WHAT DO ELDERS AND DEACONS DO?

Elders and Deacons are voluntary office bearers in the Congregation. They join the pastoral staff in pastoral leadership and oversight, oversee the management of ORPC, assist in the administration of ORPC and in all matters concerning the building-up and growth of ORPC.

Elders serve primarily in Session and may also be appointed to the Board of Management (BoM). Session is the final decision-making body in ORPC and has particular responsibility for the spiritual mission and care of ORPC.

Deacons serve in the BoM and have particular responsibility for the physical care of God's people and for managing the material resources of ORPC to serve its spiritual mission.

WHO CAN BE NOMINATED AND ELECTED?

- Elders and Deacons must meet the biblical qualifications according to 1 Timothy 3:1-13 and Titus 1:6-9.
- Nominees must be communicant members of ORPC for more than three years.
- All nominees are expected to have served in at least one area of ministry in ORPC for a minimum period of one year prior to being nominated.
- Elders must have served for at least one term of three years as a Deacon.
- Spouses of Elders and Deacons must also be communicant members of ORPC. Divorcees and those with previously-divorced spouses do not qualify for nomination.

- Elders and Deacons must assent to the basic creeds and confessions of the Presbyterian Church, the Apostles' Creed, the Westminster Confession of Faith, the Constitution of the Synod of the Presbyterian Church in Singapore and the Constitution of ORPC.
- Elders and Deacons must attend regular Session/BoM meetings, congregational monthly prayer meetings, ministry/committee meetings as assigned, leaders' retreats, annual and extraordinary congregational meetings. They must also share in pastoral visitation and undertake other duties relevant to their office and other assigned responsibilities as decided from time to time.

HOW TO NOMINATE?

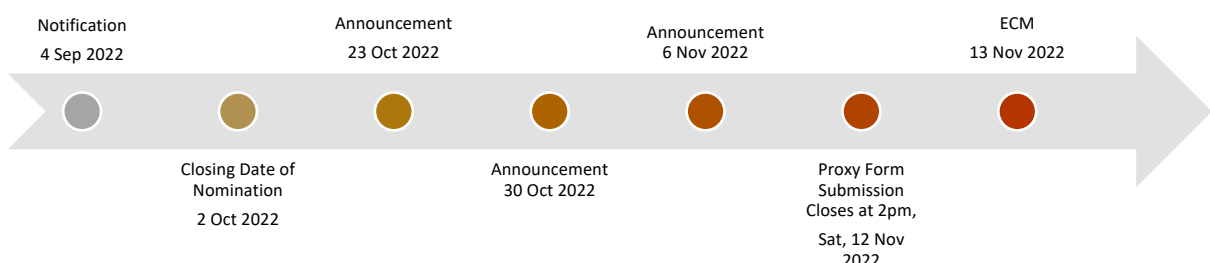
Elders and Deacons must be proposed and seconded by other communicant members of ORPC.

A member who wants to nominate another member should first check the eligibility of that other member (please see above) before making any nomination.

The proposer needs a seconder for the nomination. After both the proposer and the seconder have signed the nomination form, the nominee must sign the form to confirm his/her consent to the nomination.

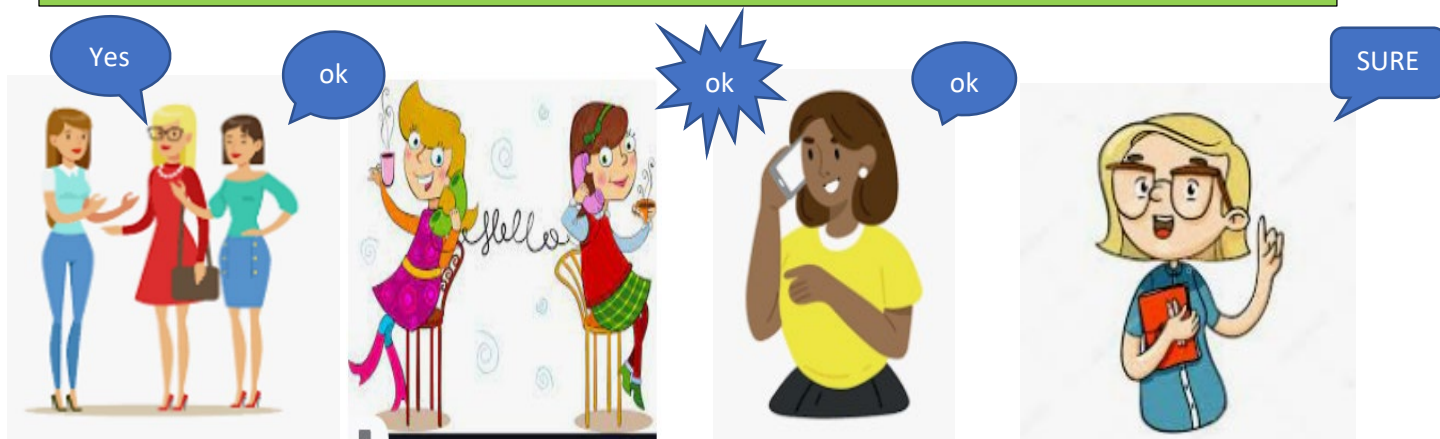
