Siding with the Truth

In life, we have to take sides sometimes. There are occasions in which this can put us in a dilemma. On the one hand, deep inside us, we know which side is in the right. On the other, there are considerations that sway us to take the side of the wrong; close relationship, peer pressure, self-interest, threats, etc. The consequences could prove dire if we chose the latter, not to mention there would be a perversion of the truth.

Pilate also found himself in such a predicament. He was under tremendous public pressure to crucify Jesus. Yet, he knew deep inside him that Jesus was innocent, but he was afraid of the people. He was afraid of their threats. He was afraid of losing his position. He tried very hard to evade responsibility. Initially, he handed Jesus over to the Jews for them to decide on the case. The Jews, however, wanted to appear clean before the Passover, so they handed Jesus back to him. Finally, he handed Jesus over to them to be crucified, and washed his hands for fear of being punished, but Jesus declared that Pilate's decision was a sin: "You would have no power over me if it were not given to you from above. Therefore the one who handed me over to you is guilty of a greater sin" (Jn. 19:11).

We can never hide our motives from God. Whenever we have to take sides on an issue, our commitment to the truth is put to the test. As Christians, we are all called to be people of the truth. Are we willing to suffer to be on the side of the truth – or would we rather do otherwise and go with the crowd, save our face, save our own skin or gain someone else's favour? Whenever we have to take sides, let us remember that the wrong choice can put us in a position that is against God.

Pilate paid dearly for not choosing to be on the side of the truth. In the Apostles' Creed, his name is associated with Jesus' death. Through the centuries, Christians all over the world recite the same, over and over again: Suffered under Pontius Pilate.

As we commemorate the death of Jesus Christ, may God give us the courage and strength to always stand as gatekeepers of the truth by siding with the truth.

Reflection:

Have there been times when you chose to protect your position or status instead of siding with the truth? If that is so, perhaps this is a good time to ask the Lord for forgiveness.

PRESBYTERIAN PRIMARY SCHOOLS—P1 PHASE 2B REGISTRATION

ORPC members who wish to register their children in Kuo Chuan Presbyterian Primary School (Bishan) or Pei Hwa Presbyterian Primary School (Bukit Timah) at Phase 2B for admission to Primary One in January 2024 may request for the Letter of Eligibility ("Form B") from the church office by emailing <u>orpcenglish@orpc.org.sg</u> stating full names (both parents of child) and at least one suitable contact number.

The eligibility for *priority* in P1 registration under Phase 2B is guided by the following conditions:

- 1. Child is either a Singapore Citizen or a Singapore Permanent Resident.
- 2. At least one parent being an active communicant member of ORPC. An 'active communicant member' refers to a baptised church member who has volunteered at least one year of service to ORPC i.e. has been serving, begun before 1 July 2022.
- 3. If the number of applicants exceed the number of vacancies in the school, places will be balloted according to the following order of priority:
 - a) Singapore Citizens will be given priority over Singapore Permanent Residents, before home-school distance is considered.
 - b) Children living within 1km of the school.
 - c) Children living between 1km and 2km of the school.
 - d) Children living outside 2km of the school.

Parents are to submit hardcopies of the following to the church office, latest, by Sunday, 7 May:

The Gospel & the Kingdom of God

This class will explore further the important question – what is the Gospel? If we understand the Gospel as Paul defines it in 1 Cor 15:3-4 – the death, burial, and resurrection of Christ – it naturally begs the question if Jesus preached the Gospel.



NOMINATION & ELECTION OF ELDERS AND DEACONS

Session is calling for an election of Elders and Deacons to be held on **Sunday, 28 May 2023**. Those elected will serve a three-year term from 1 July 2023.

ORPC members are entitled to nominate other ORPC members who have been serving faithfully in ORPC and demonstrated leadership qualities, for election as Elders or Deacons.

The closing date for nominations is **Sunday, 16 April 2023**.

Session will interview all candidates with their spouses (if any). Those who qualify and are deemed to be suitable nominees will be recommended and announced to the congregation on three Sundays (7, 14, 21 May 2023) prior to the election date.

To be duly elected, candidates must receive at least (a) two-thirds of the votes cast for Elders and (b) half of the votes cast for Deacons.

WHAT DO ELDERS AND DEACONS DO?

Elders and Deacons are voluntary office bearers in the Congregation. They join the pastoral staff in pastoral leadership and oversight, oversee the management of ORPC, assist in the administration of ORPC and in all matters concerning the buildingup and growth of ORPC.

Elders serve primarily in Session and may also be appointed to the Board of Management (BoM). Session is the final decision-making body in ORPC and has particular responsibility for the spiritual mission and growth of ORPC.

Deacons serve in the BoM and have particular responsibility for the pastoral care of God's people and for managing the material resources of ORPC to serve its spiritual mission.

WHO CAN BE NOMINATED AND ELECTED?

- Elders and Deacons must meet the biblical qualifications according to 1 Timothy 3:1-13 and Titus 1:6-9.
- Nominees must be communicant members of ORPC for more than three years.
- All nominees are expected to have served in at least one area of ministry in ORPC for a minimum period of one year prior to being nominated.
- Elders must have served for at least one term of three years as a Deacon.
- Spouses of Elders and Deacons must also be communicant members of ORPC. Divorcees and those with previously-divorced spouses do not qualify for nomination.

- Elders and Deacons must assent to the basic creeds and confessions of the Presbyterian Church, the Apostles' Creed, the Westminster Confession of Faith, the Constitution of the Synod of the Presbyterian Church in Singapore and the Constitution of ORPC.
- Elders and Deacons must attend regular Session/BoM meetings, congregational monthly prayer meetings, ministry/committee meetings as assigned, leaders' retreats, annual and extraordinary congregational meetings. They must also share in pastoral visitation and undertake other duties relevant to their office and other assigned responsibilities as decided from time to time.


HOW TO NOMINATE?

Elders and Deacons must be proposed and seconded by other communicant members of ORPC.

A member who wants to nominate another member should first check the eligibility of that other member (please see above) before making any nomination.

The proposer needs a seconder for the nomination. After both the proposer and the seconder have signed the nomination form, the nominee must sign the form to confirm his/her consent to the nomination.
