When I pray...

What exactly is prayer? One view is that prayer is just talking to God as you would to anyone. But there is one major difference. When talking to God, we cannot see, hear or touch Him.

In my view, prayer is about engaging in a relationship with God. And how we relate to God will determine how we pray to Him. A person who views God as a loving father will pray differently from one who views Him as a disciplinarian.

The wonderful thing is that we have a God who is majestic, all powerful and supreme, and who loves to respond to his children's prayers. He wants to have a close, caring and complete relationship with us. As a result, we can pray to God in a meaningful, healthy and loving manner.

Why should we pray? Below are some reasons:

1. We want to express our deep and heartfelt love for God;
2. We want to ask for forgiveness arising from any wrongdoing;
3. We want to give thanks to God for His blessings;
4. We ask God to solve problems faced by us or others; and
5. We are hurting and ask for God's comfort

Furthermore, our prayers during our solitude with God, tells us much about ourselves. For example:

1. Do we pray for God to bless us with wealth or are we happy to ask for our needs to be met? In other words, do we ask for a feast or just a sufficient meal?
2. Do we ask for success in our endeavours or do we pray for us to be useful to God?
3. Do we ask for a life of joy and happiness or do we pray to be a source of joy and happiness to others?
4. Do we ask God to support a decision that we have made or do we ask God to guide us on how to make a decision?
5. Do we pray for social recognition or do we ask for strength to serve unrecognised to further God's kingdom?
6. How much of our prayers are dedicated to making the lives of our enemies difficult? How much of our prayers are dedicated to loving others (including our enemies)?

I am very humbled every time these thoughts come to my mind...

As we mature in faith, our prayers will become less ego-centric and more God-centred. Our hearts will be changed and our love for others will grow.

May God continue to change our hearts and help us cultivate our prayer life...

PRESBYTERIAN PRIMARY SCHOOLS—P1 PHASE 2B REGISTRATION

ORPC members who wish to register their children in Kuo Chuan Presbyterian Primary School (Bishan) or Pei Hwa Presbyterian Primary School (Bukit Timah) at Phase 2B for admission to Primary One in January 2024 may request for the Letter of Eligibility ("Form B") from the church office by emailing orpcenglish@orpc.org.sg stating full names (both parents of child) and at least one suitable contact number.

The eligibility for *priority* in P1 registration under Phase 2B is guided by the following conditions:

1. Child is either a Singapore Citizen or a Singapore Permanent Resident.
2. At least one parent being an active communicant member of ORPC. An 'active communicant member' refers to a baptised church member who has volunteered at least one year of service to ORPC i.e. has been serving, begun before 1 July 2022.
3. If the number of applicants exceed the number of vacancies in the school, places will be balloted according to the following order of priority:
 - a) Singapore Citizens will be given priority over Singapore Permanent Residents, before home-school distance is considered.
 - b) Children living within 1km of the school.
 - c) Children living between 1km and 2km of the school.
 - d) Children living outside 2km of the school.

- **Parents are to submit hardcopies of the following to the church office, latest, by Sunday, 7 May:**
 1. 'Letter of Eligibility' ("Form B") with Section A completed;
 2. Photocopy of Child's birth certificate/Citizenship certificate/PR document;
 3. Photocopy of both parents' NRIC.

- **Parents will still need to complete an online registration (MOE's) under Phase 2B national registration exercise in July 2023. Do watch out for MOE's registration dates and documents required e.g. child's immunisation records, etc.** <https://www.moe.gov.sg/primary/p1-registration/how-to-register?pt=2B>

NOMINATION & ELECTION OF ELDERS AND DEACONS

Session is calling for an election of Elders and Deacons to be held on **Sunday, 28 May 2023**. Those elected will serve a three-year term from 1 July 2023.

ORPC members are entitled to nominate other ORPC members who have been serving faithfully in ORPC and demonstrated leadership qualities, for election as Elders or Deacons.

The closing date for nominations is **Sunday, 16 April 2023**.

Session will interview all candidates with their spouses (if any). Those who qualify and are deemed to be suitable nominees will be recommended and announced to the congregation on three Sundays (7, 14, 21 May 2023) prior to the election date.

To be duly elected, candidates must receive at least (a) two-thirds of the votes cast for Elders and (b) half of the votes cast for Deacons.

WHAT DO ELDERS AND DEACONS DO?

Elders and Deacons are voluntary office bearers in the Congregation. They join the pastoral staff in pastoral leadership and oversight, oversee the management of ORPC, assist in the administration of ORPC and in all matters concerning the building-up and growth of ORPC.

Elders serve primarily in Session and may also be appointed to the Board of Management (BoM). Session is the final decision-making body in ORPC and has particular responsibility for the spiritual mission and growth of ORPC.

Deacons serve in the BoM and have particular responsibility for the pastoral care of God's people and for managing the material resources of ORPC to serve its spiritual mission.

WHO CAN BE NOMINATED AND ELECTED?

- Elders and Deacons must meet the biblical qualifications according to 1 Timothy 3:1-13 and Titus 1:6-9.
- Nominees must be communicant members of ORPC for more than three years.
- All nominees are expected to have served in at least one area of ministry in ORPC for a minimum period of one year prior to being nominated.
- Elders must have served for at least one term of three years as a Deacon.
- Spouses of Elders and Deacons must also be communicant members of ORPC. Divorcees and those with previously-divorced spouses do not qualify for nomination.

- Elders and Deacons must assent to the basic creeds and confessions of the Presbyterian Church, the Apostles' Creed, the Westminster Confession of Faith, the Constitution of the Synod of the Presbyterian Church in Singapore and the Constitution of ORPC.
- Elders and Deacons must attend regular Session/BoM meetings, congregational monthly prayer meetings, ministry/committee meetings as assigned, leaders' retreats, annual and extraordinary congregational meetings. They must also share in pastoral visitation and undertake other duties relevant to their office and other assigned responsibilities as decided from time to time.

HOW TO NOMINATE?

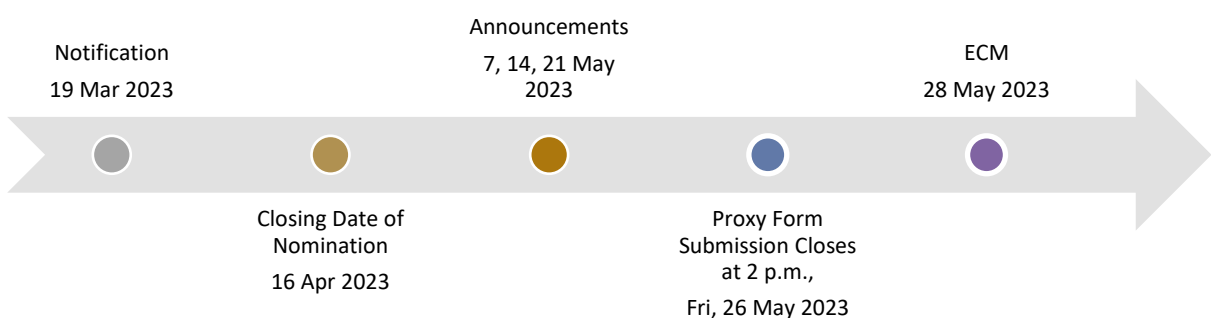
Elders and Deacons must be proposed and seconded by other communicant members of ORPC.

A member who wants to nominate another member should first check the eligibility of that other member (please see above) before making any nomination.

The proposer needs a seconder for the nomination. After both the proposer and the seconder have signed the nomination form, the nominee must sign the form to confirm his/her consent to the nomination.
