Fed or Not

“I don't feel that I'm being fed spiritually.” I've heard this several times from friends on why they are changing church. Maybe they don't understand the preaching or the teaching in church doesn't address their real needs and struggles. Maybe the music or the preaching, though spiritually nourishing, is not to their taste and style. Or maybe they feel they've heard it all before — eating familiar food feels like not having eaten at all. Or perhaps they don't like the leadership or the church's direction, or they don't feel heard.

What does it mean to be spiritually fed? In Matthew 28:18-20, Jesus commissions his disciples to make disciples, baptising them in the name of the Trinity and teaching them to obey Jesus. In Acts 2:42, the early church did this by devoting themselves to teaching, fellowship, breaking of bread, and prayer. That's how they were fed and they grew. They were fed on all of these, not on teaching alone. Hearing and studying God's word is a key spiritual food, but it isn't the complete diet.

But don't we come to church to be fed? Yet if each of us needs to be fed by someone more spiritual than us, where will this chain stop? As spiritual infants, we should be fed and grounded in the basics of the faith, but the end goal is to learn to feed ourselves, to sit under God's Word for ourselves and actively live it out. That's what it means to grow up from spiritual infancy into spiritual adulthood. Then hearing God's Word preached is no longer our only source of spiritual feeding but becomes supplementary to our own Bible study and reflection; it serves as a reminder and an alignment in how I live out God's Word.

But how can we make disciples if we don't first learn every detail about being a disciple and making disciples? Don't we need to be fed first before we can go and feed others? Yes, but we first need to be fed by Jesus. We need to sit at Jesus' feet *ourselves* to listen and learn from him. We need to be active apprentices to Jesus by going out and doing his work with him. Yes, it is important to have good, solid, gospel-based teaching and preaching. But feeling spiritually unfed is not a preacher-problem or a church-problem. It's an each-of-us-problem. Each of us has a personal responsibility to know God, to have a relationship with him, to love him and serve him. This is not something that we can blame others for. Each of us has chosen to follow Jesus. Will we take on the responsibility of following him?



The Gospel According to Jesus

With the publication of John MacArthur's book in 1988, *The Gospel According to Jesus*, a very important debate among evangelicals quickly followed, often dividing Christian communities into the so-called "Lordship Salvation" camp and the "Free Grace" camp. The concern is that many people profess to follow Christ, yet don't display the fruit of that confession in their lives. Others leave the faith altogether after some years of church involvement. Were those people ever saved? That question prompts us to examine the substance of the gospel according to Jesus.

Our lesson will explore the following questions -

1. What truths must you know and believe to be saved?
2. What is the complete gospel message?
3. Does saving faith always produce fruit?

The issue at hand is whether, in addition to belief in the gospel, repentance from sin, obedience to God, and submission to Christ's lordship are necessary for sinners to be saved.

PRESBYTERIAN PRIMARY SCHOOLS—P1 PHASE 2B REGISTRATION

ORPC members who wish to register their children in Kuo Chuan Presbyterian Primary School (Bishan) or Pei Hwa Presbyterian Primary School (Bukit Timah) at Phase 2B for admission to Primary One in January 2024 may request for the Letter of Eligibility ("Form B") from the church office by emailing orpcenglish@orpc.org.sg stating full names (both parents of child) and at least one suitable contact number.

The eligibility for *priority* in P1 registration under Phase 2B is guided by the following conditions:

1. Child is either a Singapore Citizen or a Singapore Permanent Resident.
2. At least one parent being an active communicant member of ORPC. An 'active communicant member' refers to a baptised church member who has volunteered at least one year of service to ORPC i.e. has been serving, begun before 1 July 2022.
3. If the number of applicants exceed the number of vacancies in the school, places will be balloted according to the following order of priority:
 - a) Singapore Citizens will be given priority over Singapore Permanent Residents, before home-school distance is considered.
 - b) Children living within 1km of the school.
 - c) Children living between 1km and 2km of the school.
 - d) Children living outside 2km of the school.

- **Parents are to submit hardcopies of the following to the church office, latest, by Sunday, 7 May:**
 1. 'Letter of Eligibility' ("Form B") with Section A completed;
 2. Photocopy of Child's birth certificate/Citizenship certificate/PR document;
 3. Photocopy of both parents' NRIC.

- **Parents will still need to complete an online registration (MOE's) under Phase 2B national registration exercise in July 2023.
