5. Consider what Jesus says is the source of our rejoicing, and what He says are the costs of following Him. Is it worth it to follow Jesus?

6. What is the main point of this passage?

7. What applications have you made to your life and faith? Discuss them as a group.

Think about why you follow Jesus. What has it cost you, and what joy has it brought? Share this with your group.

4. What does the Lord's Prayer (Luke 11:2-4) teach us about Jesus' priorities and what He believed?

5. What assurance do we have that God will answer our prayers and give us provision?
