“What is Christian Discipleship?”

One of my favorite verses in the NT is 2 Tim 2:2: “And the things you have heard me say in the presence of many witnesses entrust to reliable people who will also be qualified to teach others.” This is meaningful to me, because it focuses on Christian discipleship in terms of the need to help others to follow Jesus.

In the beginning of his ministry, Paul had already sensed the incredible responsibility of being a follower and an apostle of Jesus Christ. He writes that we are “entrusted with the gospel” (1 Thess 2:4). That means he was to guard the gospel and to commit it to the next generation of Christians. It is no wonder why he devoted much instruction to Timothy, Titus, and many others.

What exactly do we mean by Christian discipleship? On a personal level, it means to follow Jesus and to become more like him in our Christian journey. However, that is merely part of the equation. On a more inter-personal level, it means every Christian is responsible to bring others to maturity in Christ. All of us, in a sense, are discipling or being disciplined. There is no middle or neutral ground. Christian discipleship is deliberate in its goal—to help others become more like Jesus. This is sacrificial service and much effort and time are required for people to change.

However, we can be encouraged in spite of the difficulty of the work. Why? Because discipleship is also divine work. Paul writes: “being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus.” The work of conversion is ultimately the work of God, involving frail people such as ourselves.

Living in a society that is becoming stridently individualistic, this is a huge challenge. That is why the church needs to be intensely intentional in discipling others. All sorts of people join churches for various reasons. Some are more well-founded than others. But all people are looking for help in their lives. Discipleship involves teaching, mentoring, and modeling the Christian faith. There are many good teaching resources available. At the end of the day, curriculum is not the main concern. The challenge in the years to come is for every Christian to get equipped and disciple others until Jesus returns.

Saturday

Read Luke 12:35-48. What does this passage say about Jesus' return?

The Gospel According to the Apostle Paul

When exploring the apostle Paul's understanding of the "gospel," we clearly see development of theology within the Bible storyline. The gospel Paul preached was this: "For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, and then to the Twelve" (1 Cor 15:3-5).

While Jesus focused the gospel on the Kingdom of God, Paul recognized that Jesus' resurrection was critical to the good news of salvation. Paul emphasized the cross as the very centre of the gospel message. This has important theological and historical implications.

In our lesson, we will examine the historicity of Jesus' resurrection and what that means for us personally and our proclamation of the gospel.

HISTORY OF THE CHURCH

The Orchard Road Presbyterian Church was founded in 1856 to minister to the needs of the Scots community in Singapore. The first church building on the present site was completed in 1878, and has been extended several times, notably in 1975 when the sanctuary was extended and in 1985 when the new extension of the Dunman Hall was completed and a new chapel was built. Alongside the growth of the physical facilities has been the development of the church from an English-speaking expatriate congregation to a local church embracing four different language congregations and a new branch church at Bukit Batok (1995). In addition to the English-speaking congregation, the Indonesian congregation (1976) and the German congregation (1978) now regularly worship and minister as part of Orchard Road Presbyterian Church. In 2005, the Mandarin congregation (1968) became independent as Providence Presbyterian Church but continues to use the buildings for worship and ministry. In 2013, the branch church at Bukit Batok also became independent and is now Bukit Batok Presbyterian Church.

FAITH AND MEMBERSHIP

As a church with our roots in historic Presbyterianism growing out of the Westminster Confession of Faith, we affirm the Lordship of our Saviour, Jesus Christ. We look to the Scriptures as the inspired word of God and the one authoritative and infallible standard for our faith and practice. We welcome those who profess Jesus Christ as their personal Lord and Saviour into our formal membership. Our membership is truly international, representing the breadth of God's call upon people from all ethnic and economic backgrounds.

Members are received upon initial profession of faith in Jesus Christ by baptism, confirmation and in transfer from other Christian churches. Classes for baptism, confirmation and for transfer of membership are held periodically and announced in the bulletin.
