Meekness

Many tourist attractions offer horse-riding experiences. These horses have been trained so they will not run like wild horses. As a result, tourists can safely ride on them. By nature, a horse is strong and can run fast but when it is controlled by a bit and bridle, it can stop doing so as it submits to its rider's will. A gentle or meek person is likened to a horse controlled by a bit and bridle. Even though he is strong, he submits to God's will.

Jesus says, "Blessed are the **meek**, for they will inherit the earth" (Matt 5:5). Why is it that the meek but not the powerful who will inherit the earth? Greek scholar W. E. Vine says that in the Bible, meekness is seen as an attitude towards God "in which we accept His dealings with us as good, and therefore without disputing or resisting". This is seen in Jesus, who delights in doing His Father's will. He possesses the power to summon angels to come down from Heaven to stop His crucifixion but He did not. Instead, He chose to leave the circumstances to God.

It is no wonder that the Bible refers to Jesus as meek. Jesus told His weary, heavy-laden followers, "Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am **meek** and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls" (Matt 11:29, ASV).

Jim White, in his book *Christlikeness* relates the testimony of a janitor that aptly illustrates the meaning of meekness. The first time they met, Jim asked him, "How are you?" He replied, "Oh not so bad, probably better off than most people." As their conversation progressed, he told Jim that he was a Christian and his 12-year-old son had been killed by a lorry while riding a bicycle. At the scene, he did not cry over his son but instead comforted the lorry driver. When a puzzled policeman at the scene asked him for the reason, he said his son was a Christian so he knew where his son was, but the lorry driver had no hope, and needed comfort. Next, he told Jim that his wife was also a Christian. She could not get over the grief of losing her son, and ended up in a mental institution. He had to work hard to pay the hospital bill. Since the state felt he could not take care of his daughter on his salary, he had to put her in a foster home. The painful part for him was to hear his daughter calling another man 'Daddy'.

Here was a man who submitted to God in the midst of extreme circumstances, without rebellion. Although he lived with the daily pain that stemmed from the loss of his son, his wife being in a mental institution, and his daughter calling another man 'Daddy', he was able to say, "Oh, not so bad, probably better off than most people." This is true meekness in action and is the life and character to which God has called us to live out.

When we are tired and troubled, Jesus invites us to discover the peace of meekly trusting Him. ~ David McCasland ~

The Apostles' Creed: "He descended into hell"

In the traditional version of the Apostles' Creed, one paragraph reads: "He descended into hell, the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven and sitteth on the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from thence He shall come to judge the quick and the dead." Perhaps the most controversial line in the creed is "[Jesus] descended into hell." Presumably, the biblical basis for this line is 1 Peter 3:19, which states that Jesus "went and proclaimed to the spirit in prison." However, there is no textual basis in the New Testament to claim that Jesus was preaching to souls imprisoned in hell between his death and resurrection (Easter and Good Friday).

Not only is there little biblical support for this view, but the claim is also inconsistent with Jesus' statement, when he spoke to the thief next to him and assured him, that "today you will be with me in paradise" (Luke 23:43). Besides the view on hell, there have been two other meanings proposed throughout church history. John Calvin, for example, takes this phrase to mean that Christ suffered the pains of hell while on the cross. The Heidelberg Catechism (1563), a document expounding Reformed doctrine, also holds to this view.

Others have understood it to mean that Christ continued in the "state of death" until his resurrection. The Westminster Larger Catechism (1647), Question 50 takes this approach: "Christ's humiliation after his death consisted in his being buried, and continuing in the state of death, and under the power of death till the third day; which hath been otherwise expressed in these words, He descended into hell." This is the view that we have taken.

What is the significance of the Apostles' Creed for today? As D. A. Carson explains, the creed "very ably summarizes the gospel itself in just a few sentences." The affirmation that Jesus continued in a state of death was included as a corrective to heretical views that claim Jesus was less than fully human and that he did not die a human death. The gospel insists that Jesus died a real death and he rose on the third day, as the basis for the believer's hope for bodily resurrection one day (1 Cor 15).

It is for this reason that we have decided to use the contemporary version of the Apostles' Creed, which reads "He descended to the grave. On the third day he rose again, He ascended into heaven, and is seated on the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead."

1. What's the difference between the two versions?

The difference is primarily in updating words to better reflect contemporary meanings due to language shifts over time, as well as a clarification in wording to prevent misunderstandings due to cultural developments.

For example, "maker" is replaced by "creator", "hell" with "dead", "quick" with "living". Some words are no longer in modern use – "sitteth" and "thence" have therefore been replaced. The "how" of the conception by the Holy Spirit has also been clarified.

From thence he shall come to judge the quick and He will come again to judge the living and the the dead. I believe in the Holy Ghost, I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic* Church, the holy catholic* Church, the communion of saints, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen and the life everlasting. Amen.

^{*}The word "catholic" means universal and does not refer to the Roman Catholic Church.

What is hell?

In the Old Testament, the word often translated as "hell" is *sheol* (Heb) – which simply means the place of the dead. In the New Testament, the equivalent word is *hades* (Gk) – which is again the place of the dead. For both languages, heaven (*shamayim* in Heb and *ouranos* in Greek) was not a place for humans and not an option for humans after death (instead of heaven, deserving Greeks went to *Elysium* which was in *Hades*).

The theological understanding of "hell" is a different question from what "hell" means in the Apostles' Creed. The theological understanding of hell is that hell is the infinite and eternal death which we have earned because of our sin. In Scripture it is depicted as a place of suffering and torment (Rev 14:10-11), with eternal fire (Matt 25:41, Luke 16:23-24), shame and everlasting contempt (Dan 12:2). Hell is where those who are dead in sin are forever subject to the fury and wrath of the righteous and just God.

2. Where was Christ between Good Friday and Easter?

Jesus' body was buried in the tomb for those three days. Other than this, the Bible's only word on this is what Jesus said on the cross to the thief next to him – that he will be in paradise (Luke 23:43).

3. What does 1 Peter 3:19 mean then?

An interpretation of this text is that Jesus had previously done this – preaching to the people of Noah's day through Noah while they were still living on earth, and these are the people who heard the message, rejected it, perished in the flood of Noah's day, and are now in prison i.e. hell.



HOW THE GOSPEL CHANGES US

The Apostle Paul writes in 2 Cor 9:13 "...others will praise God for the obedience that accompanies your confession of the gospel..." What does it mean that our obedience to God is based on the confession of the gospel? Most Christians would say that we are transformed by God when we live like Jesus. That is a good response, but there is much more to it than just trying to live like Jesus. The term "confession" in the Greek means "hold fast" to the gospel.

In our lesson, we will explore how the gospel actually transforms the Christian's heart in a deep and profound way. We will consider:

- 1. the barriers that keep us from genuine change,
- 2. the freedom from sin that the gospel provides, and
- 3. the motivation for long-lasting transformation.

HISTORY OF THE CHURCH

The Orchard Road Presbyterian Church was founded in 1856 to minister to the needs of the Scots community in Singapore. The first church building on the present site was completed in 1878, and has been extended several times, notably in 1975 when the sanctuary was extended and in 1985 when the new extension of the Dunman Hall was completed and a new chapel was built. Alongside the growth of the physical facilities has been the development of the church from an English-speaking expatriate congregation to a local church embracing four different language congregations and a new branch church at Bukit Batok (1995). In addition to the English-speaking congregation, the Indonesian congregation (1976) and the German congregation (1978) now regularly worship and minister as part of Orchard Road Presbyterian Church. In 2005, the Mandarin congregation (1968) became independent as Providence Presbyterian Church but continues to use the buildings for worship and ministry. In 2013, the branch church at Bukit Batok also became independent and is now Bukit Batok Presbyterian Church.

FAITH AND MEMBERSHIP

As a church with our roots in historic Presbyterianism growing out of the Westminster Confession of Faith, we affirm the Lordship of our Saviour, Jesus Christ. We look to the Scriptures as the inspired word of God and the one authoritative and infallible standard for our faith and practice. We welcome those who profess Jesus Christ as their personal Lord and Saviour into our formal membership. Our membership is truly international, representing the breadth of God's call upon people from all ethnic and economic backgrounds.

Members are received upon initial profession of faith in Jesus Christ by baptism, confirmation and in transfer from other Christian churches. Classes for baptism, confirmation and for transfer of membership are held periodically and announced in the bulletin.

THE APOSTLES' CREED
