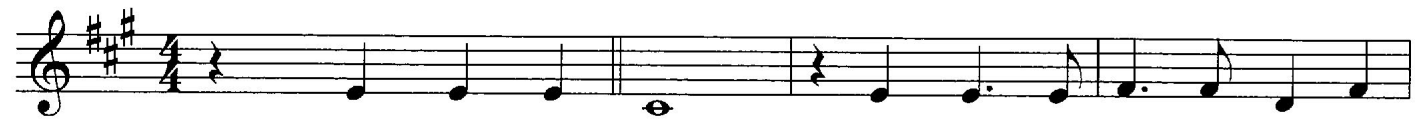

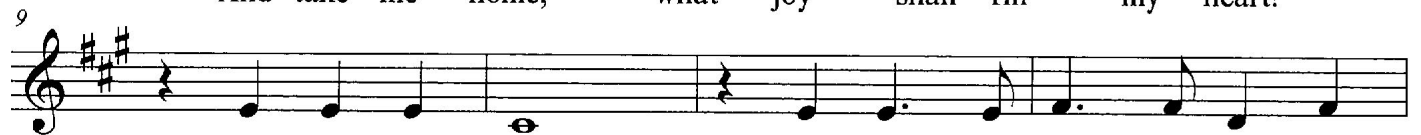



Precious but Not Coveted

This character trait

- a. is precious but not coveted by the world;
- b. is such that if you think you have it, you don't;
- c. has value that stems from a lowliness that is divine and admirable;
- d. is a precondition for many other admirable qualities like teachability, compassion, etc.; and
- e. appears weak but has inner strength and resilience.

Brothers and sisters, I am talking about the character trait of spiritual humility. What then is spiritual humility?

Isaiah 57:15 says, 'For this is what the high and exalted One says- he who lives forever, whose name is holy: "I live in a high and holy place, but also with the one who is contrite and lowly in spirit, to revive the spirit of the lowly and to revive the heart of the contrite."'

A spiritually humble person is in love with and aware of our loving God. This empowers him to love other people because they are created and loved by God.

A spiritually humble person recognises that he is not self-sufficient. Instead, he depends on God for everything. This includes his life, salvation, future, family, friends, talents and gifts. He is aware that God has given him everything, so he is the owner of nothing.

Furthermore, his reverence for God is not dependent on what God has given him but on who God is, particularly His love, mercy and perfect justice which transcend human understanding.

How then do we become spiritually humble? Well, by obeying, following and learning from our Lord and God, Jesus, whose humility exudes love and righteousness. In fact, Jesus has said, "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls" (Matthew 11:28-29).

Brothers and sisters, I am a very long way from being a paragon of humility. Each day, the Lord is honing, correcting and disciplining me as I journey in life with Him.

But like a star in a constellation, I am accompanied by many, and together, we provide mutual support to each other until the journey is completed.

As ORPC celebrates its 167th anniversary today, may we continue with life's journey as a church, ever humbly submitting ourselves to the guidance and direction of our loving, wise and divine Shepherd.

Friday

Read Acts 1:12-14. What were the disciples doing? Do we do the same?

Give thanks for 2023 church camp committee and the work they have done in bringing us together this year. Pray for the 2024 church camp committee to serve with joy and love, and that through their time and effort organising the camp, both them and the church will be blessed.

Saturday

Read Acts 1:1-14. What is the main message of Acts 1:1-14? What difference does this make in your faith today?

The Gospel: The Call for a Response

The Christian gospel always calls for and expects a response from those who hear it. Thus, Jesus himself preached, "Repent and believe the good news!" (Mark 1:15). Paul declared to everyone to whom he preached, "Turn to God in repentance and have faith in our Lord Jesus" (Acts 20:21). Through faith, sinners receive Jesus' sacrificial death for the forgiveness of our sins. 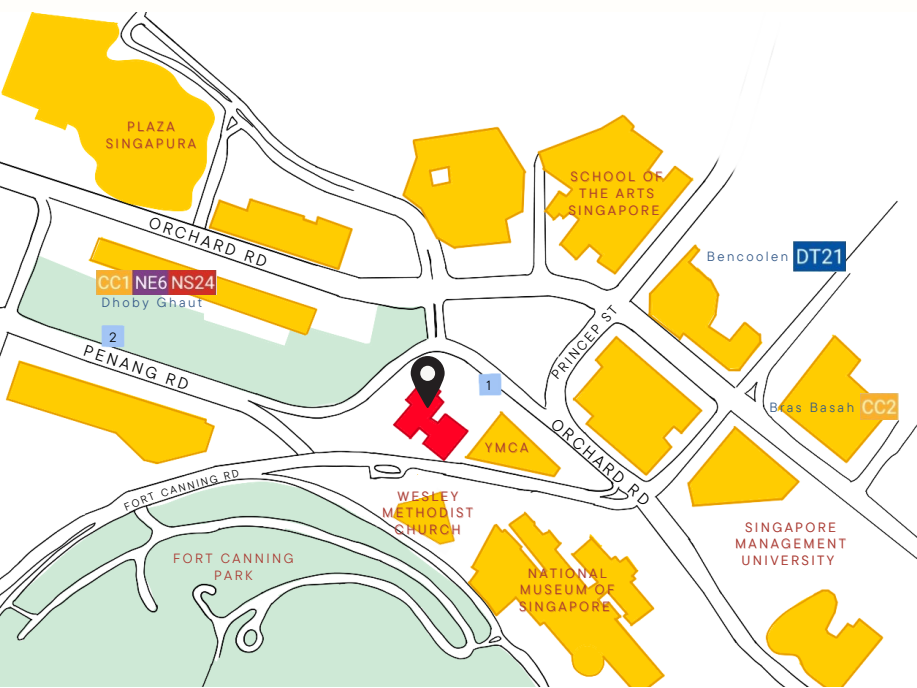

HISTORY

The Orchard Road Presbyterian Church (ORPC) was founded in 1856 to minister to the needs of the Scots community in Singapore. The first church building on the present site was completed in 1878, and has been extended several times. In 1975, the sanctuary was extended, and in 1985, the new extension of Dunman Hall was completed and a new chapel was built. Alongside the growth of the physical facilities has been the development of the church from an English-speaking expatriate congregation to a local church embracing four different language congregations. In 1995 we planted a branch church (Bukit Batok Presbyterian Church) which became independent in 2013. Similarly, our Mandarin congregation (Providence Presbyterian Church) became independent in 2005. ORPC consists of the English Congregation and the Indonesian Congregation, and worshipping with us now in the same building are Providence Presbyterian Church, and the German-speaking Protestant Congregation in Singapore.

FAITH AND MEMBERSHIP

As a church with roots in historic Presbyterianism growing out of the Westminster Confession of Faith, we affirm the Lordship of our Saviour, Jesus Christ. We look to the Scriptures as the inspired Word of God and the one authoritative and infallible standard for our faith and practice. We welcome those who profess Jesus Christ as their personal Lord and Saviour into our formal membership. Our membership is truly international, representing the breadth of God's call upon people from all ethnic and economic backgrounds. Members are received upon initial profession of faith in Jesus Christ by baptism, confirmation, and in transfer from other Christian churches. Classes for baptism, confirmation, and for transfer of membership are held periodically and announced in the bulletin.

THE APOSTLES' CREED

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary.
