Community of Faith



"Discovering God's Vision for Re-building" Neh. 1:1-11

You remember the story? Nehemiah returned to Jerusalem to rebuild the wall around the city—a big project for his team of Jewish exiles! We read from vv. 1-4 that Nehemiah was troubled when he received report that the Jewish people in Judah were in distress, and the wall of Jerusalem was broken down. This left the city vulnerable to enemy attacks.

Upon hearing this news, Nehemiah mourned, fasted, and prayed to God. The story goes on to describe how he received a vision from God. From the outset, it is clear that the vision to rebuild the wall was formed out of an intensive desire to meet an important need. So, what did Nehemiah do? First, he went to God. The answer to the vision is not a strategy or a plan. The answer is God. He sought the Lord and prayed earnestly.

Secondly, Nehemiah was wise enough to realize that he could not just plunge into a wall rebuilding project. Something important had to be dealt with—the sin of Israel (read vv. 6-7). An important lesson can be gleaned from this passage. As the people of God, we cannot move ahead when God is in the midst of purging our sinfulness. We will be frustrated all the time. We need first to confess sin. I always ask God this: is there sin behind all the pain and trauma of God's people? Nehemiah stood between the people's sin and God, and confessed their sin to God. We cannot move ahead when people's sin is in the way. Without confession and turning away from sin, the Spirit cannot break through to us. We need God's cleansing of our sins.

Thirdly, the people of God need to claim God's promises for meeting that need (vv. 5, 8-11). Then God will lead and commission them to meeting that need. What was it that Nehemiah remembered about God's promises to his fore-father Moses? God promised to gather his exiled people and bring them to the place he has chosen as a dwelling, if they repented obeyed the Lord.

How do we know if a vision is from God? There are two confirmers of a vision. One, the proclamation validator. As leaders, we need to share it publicly, risking opposition and rejection. That's exactly what Nehemiah did. If leaders are afraid to tell people about it, the vision is not from God (2:1-3). Two, the permission validator (2:4-8). If the people do not give you their permission to go ahead, stop!

Bible Readings & Prayer Points

Monday

Read Psalm 69:1-3. What was happening in the life of the psalmist?

Pray for our elected deacons, Benjamin Goh and Liow Koh Chuan, that God will grant them guidance and strength as they serve Him in the roles they are taking charge of.

Tuesday

Read Psalm 69:4. The Lord Jesus quoted this verse concerning Himself in John 15:25. How was it fulfilled in His life?

Pray for God to grant wisdom and discernment to global leaders as well as to those in positions to influence the course of the Israel-Hamas war.

Wednesday

Read Psalm 69:6. The psalmist expressed his concern about not being a stumbling block to others who were seeking God. How does this apply to us, in our own spiritual influence on those around us?

Pray for churches in Singapore, in their love for Christ and His mission, to send many to share the gospel with those who have lost hope.

Thursday

Read Psalm 69:7-9a. This psalm, which refers to King David initially but subsequently to the Lord Jesus, reveals a "Zeal for your house (that) will consume me" (Jn 2:17). What future prophetic significance would this reference have?

Pray for Sunday School (SS) superintendent Jane Tham, Ps Casurine Low, and all the teachers that God will grant them wisdom as they lead, guide and teach their SS children.

Friday

Read Psalm 69:9b. The Apostle Paul quoted this part of verse 9 to show that Jesus had come not to please Himself (Rom. 15:3). What does this mean for us today?

Pray for tomorrow's Congregational Fellowship's Thanksgiving Lunch, that God will bless the occasion as we remember His faithfulness and goodness.

Saturday

Read Psalm 69:1-9. How can we imitate, in our own lives, Jesus' willingness to suffer injustice and hatred?

Pray for tomorrow's Membership Sunday, as we welcome 2 of our youths; Joel Chua and Marie Tan, and 6 of our young adults; Lim Yan Di, Valerie Lee, Jasmine Wangko, Noah Huang, Shirlin Koh and Yun Long, into our ORPC family. Pray that they will continue to grow in their understanding of their faith in Jesus Christ, and their love and service for Him.



Summary of Feedback and Suggestions received on A&A Proposal 07 Nov 2023

On 30th September 2023, the Alteration and Additions (A&A) steering committee for the church building held a fruitful dialogue session with members of the ORPC congregation. Since then, we have continued to receive more feedback and suggestions from members.

The church belongs to all of us, to both our present and future generations. We are heartened at the continued support, interest and participation in the future of our church.

In the document below, we outline some of the matters raised about the project to date in order to keep everyone updated on the latest developments.

Some of the most salient themes discussed were the legal implications, the scope of work, funding, time-line of project as well as the need to improve upon our communication between leaders and members of the ORPC congregation. The committee's responses to these themes have also been included.

Where we can, we will seek to incorporate your feedback while considering the existing site constraints, with the goal of achieving the best collective outcome for the future of our church.

1) Legal Implications:

A concern was raised regarding the legal implications that may arise if we were to vacate the present premises during the A&A works, as it may lead to a legal situation where the government may repossess the site on the grounds that it is not used for public worship purposes as stipulated in the land grant and Certificate of Title. We have been advised to seek legal advice on this matter, and not to proceed with the proposed A&A works without first obtaining an unequivocal and legally binding confirmation from the State that the proposal is not a breach of the condition attached to the land and the same will not trigger a reversion of the land to the State.

Response: Session intends to seek independent legal advice and clearance from the relevant authorities before deciding to cease public worship for any period at our church land.

2) Scope of Work:

A question was also raised regarding the proposal being over and above the scope of work mandated at the Extraordinary Congregation Meeting (ECM), given that a prior decision was already made on the exact scope of work to be carried out. The member also sought to understand the necessity for strengthening of the rear slope behind the Sanctuary and Chapel.

Response: Session appreciates the mandate given on 19th Jan, 2020. However, three years on and since the beginning of 2023, the A&A Steering Committee has undertaken a fresh review of the scope of work required and its associated costs. The A&A Steering Committee has identified an option where with an incremental cost of \$4 million, Dunman Building will be reconstructed into a five storey building to better meet present and future ministry needs. This alternative approach was presented for Session's consideration and has received unanimous support from the church leadership to bring forward for ORPC congregation consideration.

3) Enhancing the usage of our church premises:

A few members have raised the possibility of using the enhanced church facilities for greater outreach to our surrounding community; promoting the Christian faith to the youths, students and seniors, leveraging on our location and ministry potentials.

Response: The Session and A&A Steering Committee acknowledge the tremendous ministry potential that ORPC may offer, given its strategic location and history. We will seek to maximise flexibility during the design and planning phase so that the ministry goals of a Disciple Making Church may be achieved.

4) Funding:

Given the funding gap of about \$10 million for ORPC, a question was raised as to the possibility of ORPC committing more from its accumulated reserves, leaving less to be raised from fundraising activities as the amount of \$10 million is still a substantial sum.

Another member wanted to know more about the fundraising plans and schedule and if fundraising activities can be launched now.

Question was also raised regarding the basis of cost sharing with Providence Presbyterian Church (PPC), and the legal ownership of the redevelopment as well as our commitment towards PPC in return for their sharing of A&A project cost.

Response: We noted the concern regarding the substantial funding gap. Based on current calculations, the proposed total funding requirement from ORPC is \$23 million. The Finance Committee has provided a maximum sum of \$13 million from the church's accumulated reserves towards the A&A project. The amount provided by the Finance Committee takes into consideration the need to set aside sufficient reserves for the ongoing operating expenditures of ORPC. This leaves us with a funding gap of \$10 million that needs to be raised from members. We seek your prayer and support towards this endeavour.

A Fundraising Committee is being formed to plan and execute the fundraising program. We will provide further details as they become available.

The cost sharing/commitment proposal presented at the dialogue meeting is in the midst of being discussed and negotiated with the leadership of PPC. We will provide details of any final decisions to our congregation when they are available.

Do note that current proposals are a high-level cost estimate done by professional architects. Specific costs can only be provided after a full feasibility study is conducted on our site.

5) Prayer:

A suggestion to start a prayer group specifically to pray for this project was received.

Response: A series of prayer meetings and congregation information programs are being planned currently. We hope that every member of ORPC will be able to vote on the project at the oncoming Extraordinary Congregation Meeting in an informed and prayerful manner. Prayer and Communication will remain key to the project until its completion.

We thank each of you who are joining the A&A steering committee on this journey. We will continue to share progress updates as information becomes available and ask that you continue to pray alongside us for our church's A&A project. Please continue to reach out to us to share your concerns and thoughts.

HISTORY

The Orchard Road Presbyterian Church (ORPC) was founded in 1856 to minister to the needs of the Scots community in Singapore. The first church building on the present site was completed in 1878, and has been extended several times. In 1975, the sanctuary was extended, and in 1985, the new extension of Dunman Hall was completed and a new chapel was built. Alongside the growth of the physical facilities has been the development of the church from an English-speaking expatriate congregation to a local church embracing four different language congregations. In 1995 we planted a branch church (Bukit Batok Presbyterian Church) which became independent in 2013. Similarly, our Mandarin congregation (Providence Presbyterian Church) became independent in 2005. ORPC consists of the English Congregation and the Indonesian Congregation, and worshipping with us now in the same building are Providence Presbyterian Church, and the German-speaking Protestant Congregation in Singapore.

FAITH AND MEMBERSHIP

As a church with roots in historic Presbyterianism growing out of the Westminster Confession of Faith, we affirm the Lordship of our Saviour, Jesus Christ. We look to the Scriptures as the inspired Word of God and the one authoritative and infallible standard for our faith and practice. We welcome those who profess Jesus Christ as their personal Lord and Saviour into our formal membership. Our membership is truly international, representing the breadth of God's call upon people from all ethnic and economic backgrounds. Members are received upon initial profession of faith in Jesus Christ by baptism, confirmation, and in transfer from other Christian churches. Classes for baptism, confirmation, and for transfer of membership are held periodically and announced in the bulletin.

THE APOSTLES' CREED

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the grave. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty. He will come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.
