Love Your Neighbour as Yourself

The Bible tells us to love our neighbours as ourselves (Mark 12:31, Lev 19:18). We all know this. It's one of the two greatest commandments in the Bible, and it summarises the whole of God's law together with "love the Lord your God with all your heart, mind, and soul". In theory, we all also know what it means – treat others like how we want them to treat us. In other words, be nice, act fairly, even go the extra mile. Treat others with forbearance, forgiveness, humility, extend to them grace upon grace upon grace.

Sometimes I wonder if the issue isn't so much that we don't know what love means, but that we don't know who these "others" are. Who are our neighbours? Again, we all know that the Samaritan is the one who was the neighbour to the injured man on the road (Luke 10:29-37) and that tells us that neighbours are not defined by ethnicity or any other division we can think of. Neighbours are those around us, those to whom we act with love and mercy.

"Neighbours" is actually a really inclusive term, but we do have a tendency to think of "neighbours" as anyone outside of our specific group of people. There is a value in that, because then we intentionally try to love them. But it also does mean that we then automatically exclude anyone inside our specific group of people from this category of "neighbours." Think about it, even just within our own families, they see both the best and the worst of us – we tend to forget to love our own families as our own neighbours. And this extends to our church family as well. When we think about "love our neighbours", we think about loving people outside the church, and we forget to love our neighbours inside the church. We forget that those inside the church are sinners as much as those outside the church, and they too need to be loved, treated with forbearance, forgiveness, humility, with grace upon grace upon grace extended. And we forget that as much as we love those outside the church family, they have eyes to see how we treat each other inside our own church family, which shows our truest selves and our truest beliefs. Do we love each other inside the church as ourselves, as our neighbours? That is a gauge for how true our love for our neighbour is - when our guard is down and we know we're stuck with each other; do we still love one another? Is our community still one that others would wish to join?

Bible Readings & Prayer Points

Read Exodus 23:20-33

- Why is it important for us to obey God in all areas of our lives?
- Verse 25 tells us that we must worship God. In today's context, how do we worship God?
- The passage tells us that we must not worship other gods. In today's context, what are some examples of other gods that we must not worship?

- Pray that God will continue to nurture and care for the Youth ministry
 according to His purpose whereby the youth will experience His love and
 develop their faith in Him day by day as they navigate their teenage years
 and beyond.
- Pray that as believers, we will perform acts of kindness and consideration to all even to those who are not close to us.
- Give thanks to those serving in the Finance committee. May God continue to guide them as they lend their expertise to serve in an area that helps the church maintain its financial soundness and integrity.
- Today, the United States, China and Russia are enhancing their stockpile of nuclear weapons. At the same time, there are other countries that have either acquired nuclear weapons or are in the process of developing them. This presents an existential threat to the world. Pray that God will eliminate the need for such weapons by removing hostility between rival countries and transforming the world into a bastion of peace, justice and genuine security.



Living as Christians in Religiously Diverse Singapore

Most Christians today live among ethnic and religious others across the globe. In fact, many regard Singapore as one of the most religiously diverse countries in the world.

The challenge of the Christian church in Singapore is that Christians must not only live with followers of other religions without compromising our faith, but we must also work with religious others to build a cohesive society. How can Christians live with authenticity and maintain social harmony for the common good?

In our class, we will discuss several issues:

- 1. What is religious pluralism?
- 2. Do all religions lead to the same God?
- 3. How are Christians to witness for Christ in a religiously diverse environment?



BUILDING A DISCIPLE MAKING CHURCH

OUR LEGACY OF FAITH FOR FUTURE GENERATIONS

■ Introduction

In January 2024, members of both the English and Indonesian congregations came forward to vote on the A&A project. A successful mandate was received from the congregation, granting Session to move ahead with "Approach B"; covering works for the sanctuary restoration, rear slope strengthening, reinstatement of Tomlinson Hall without a basement and the reconstruction of Dunman Building as a 5-storey building.

Since January, the A&A committee has kickstarted the project and put many parts into motion. Here are the latest developments from the team:

■ Establishment of multi-disciplinary team

We are reaching out to multi-disciplinary teams, consisting of Civil & Structural (C&S), Mechanical & Electrical (M&E) Engineers and Quantity Surveyors (QS), to be appointed as our consultants for the A&A project.

Concurrently, a "Concept Design Competition" has been launched, inviting up to 5 architecture firms with the right expertise in dealing with heritage buildings to submit their concept and costs. Their submissions will be reviewed by the Session and we expect the process of appointing architects to take approximately 4 months.

Organ restoration assessment and works

The organ is an instrumental part of our worship service, and a unique draw for church goers and visitors who enjoy organ music. However, the instrument has experienced significant wear and tear over the years. The A&A restoration of the church building is an opportune time for us to restore our beloved pipe organ and potentially enlarge our music ministry after the rebuilding works.

Members of the A&A committee have had 2 meetings with Harrison and Harrison Ltd (UK) a leading organ builder and restorer of pipe organs, based in Durham, North-east England. They will provide a quotation for the reconditioning of the pipe organ. We are also searching for an organ consultant to advise us on the restoration works

and are seeking to get 2 more quotes from other reputable organ builders for evaluation.

■ Fundraising team and account

Please continue to keep the A&A committee and project in your prayers as we undertake this massive commitment to build a disciple-making church, our legacy of faith for future generations.

PRESBYTERIAN PRIMARY SCHOOLS — P1 PHASE 2B REGISTRATION

ORPC members who wish to register their children in Kuo Chuan Presbyterian Primary School (Bishan) or Pei Hwa Presbyterian Primary School (Bukit Timah) at Phase 2B for admission to Primary One in January 2025 may request for the Letter of Eligibility ("Form B") from the church office via email stating full names (both parents of child) and at least one suitable contact number to orpcenglish@orpc.org.sg

The eligibility for *priority* in P1 registration under Phase 2B is guided by the following conditions:

- 1. Child is either a Singapore Citizen or a Singapore Permanent Resident.
- 2. At least one parent being an active communicant member of ORPC. An 'active communicant member' here refers to a baptised church member who has volunteered at least one year of service to ORPC i.e. has been serving, begun before 1 July 2023.
- 3. If the number of applicants exceed the number of vacancies in the school, places will be balloted according to the following order of priority:
 - a) Singapore Citizens will be given priority over Singapore Permanent Residents, before home-school distance is considered.
 - b) Children living within 1km of the school.

- c) Children living between 1km and 2km of the school.
- d) Children living outside 2km of the school. (Applicants may check the home-school distance via this link: https://www.onemap.gov.sg/main/v2/schoolquerymenu)
- Parents are to submit hardcopies of the following to the church office, latest, by Sunday, 28 April 2024:
 - i. 'Letter of Eligibility' ("Form B") with Section A completed;
 - ii. Photocopy of Child's birth certificate/Citizenship certificate/PR document;
 - iii. Photocopy of both parents' NRIC.
- The Letter of Eligibility issued by the Church gives the applicant priority in registration in an earlier Phase, namely Phase 2B, but does not guarantee a place in the school.

HISTORY

The Orchard Road Presbyterian Church (ORPC) was founded in 1856 to minister to the needs of the Scots community in Singapore. The first church building on the present site was completed in 1878, and has been extended several times. In 1975, the sanctuary was extended, and in 1985, the new extension of Dunman Hall was completed and a new chapel was built. Alongside the growth of the physical facilities has been the development of the church from an English-speaking expatriate congregation to a local church embracing four different language congregations. In 1995 we planted a branch church (Bukit Batok Presbyterian Church) which became independent in 2013. Similarly, our Mandarin congregation (Providence Presbyterian Church) became independent in 2005. ORPC consists of the English Congregation and the Indonesian Congregation, and worshipping with us now in the same building are Providence Presbyterian Church, and the German-speaking Protestant Congregation in Singapore.

FAITH AND MEMBERSHIP

As a church with roots in historic Presbyterianism growing out of the Westminster Confession of Faith, we affirm the Lordship of our Saviour, Jesus Christ. We look to the Scriptures as the inspired Word of God and the one authoritative and infallible standard for our faith and practice. We welcome those who profess Jesus Christ as their personal Lord and Saviour into our formal membership. Our membership is truly international, representing the breadth of God's call upon people from all ethnic and economic backgrounds. Members are received upon initial profession of faith in Jesus Christ by baptism, confirmation, and in transfer from other Christian churches. Classes for baptism, confirmation, and for transfer of membership are held periodically and announced in the bulletin.

THE APOSTLES' CREED

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the grave. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.
