SCRIPTURE

Exodus 34:29-35 NIV

²⁹ When Moses came down from Mount Sinai with the two tablets of the covenant law in his hands, he was not aware that his face was radiant because he had spoken with the Lord. ³⁰ When Aaron and all the Israelites saw Moses, his face was radiant, and they were afraid to come near him.
³¹ But Moses called to them; so Aaron and all the leaders of the community came back to him, and he spoke to them. ³² Afterward all the Israelites came near him, and he gave them all the commands the Lord had given him on Mount Sinai.

³³ When Moses finished speaking to them, he put a veil over his face. ³⁴ But whenever he entered the Lord's presence to speak with him, he removed the veil until he came out. And when he came out and told the Israelites what he had been commanded, ³⁵ they saw that his face was radiant. Then Moses would put the veil back over his face until he went in to speak with the Lord.

2 Corinthians 3:7-18 NIV

⁷ Now if the ministry that brought death, which was engraved in letters on stone, came with glory, so that the Israelites could not look steadily at the face of Moses because of its glory, transitory though it was, ⁸ will not the ministry of the Spirit be even more glorious? ⁹ If the ministry that brought condemnation was glorious, how much more glorious is the ministry that brings righteousness! ¹⁰ For what was glorious has no glory now in comparison with the surpassing glory. ¹¹ And if what was transitory came with glory, how much greater is the glory of that which lasts!

¹²Therefore, since we have such a hope, we are very bold. ¹³We are not like Moses, who would put a veil over his face to prevent the Israelites from seeing the end of what was passing away. ¹⁴But their minds were made dull, for to this day the same veil remains when the old covenant is read. It has not been

removed, because only in Christ is it taken away. ¹⁵ Even to this day when Moses is read, a veil covers their hearts. ¹⁶ But whenever anyone turns to the Lord, the veil is taken away. ¹⁷ Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom. ¹⁸ And we all, who with unveiled faces contemplate the Lord's glory, are being transformed into his image with everincreasing glory, which comes from the Lord, who is the Spirit.



PASTORAL MESSAGE

Why is integrity an indispensable Christlike attribute?

Our Lord Jesus says in John 14:6 that He is the way, the truth and the life. He embodies not just the truth, but the truth of who God is. He is always faithful and true. In Him, love and justice meet. And He changes not. Heaven and earth will pass away, but His word will remain. Hence, He is the rock we can lean on, the shelter we can find refuge in. His word is a lamp to our feet, a light to our paths.

To have integrity is to be like Him. It's to live by His truth, in devotion and sincerity of heart. It's to be reliable, steadfast, unwavering, and dependable, even when opposed. It's doing what is right, not just in people's eyes, but in His sight.

To have such integrity is to let it guard our hearts, and help us honour our commitment to God and others in our decisions. It's to live by what we value, to align our convictions with our words and actions, and to uphold God's truth and justice in our work and social spaces. It's loving and respecting others. It will help us foster trust in our relationship and build bonds in our community. In a world of moral ambiguities and compromises, it will cause us to shine like stars in the dark. We will bear witness to God's love and truth.

It's as God said to King Solomon who took over his father's throne in 1 Kings 9:4-5, "As for you, if you walk before me faithfully with integrity of heart and uprightness, as David your father did, and do all I command and observe my decrees and laws, I will establish your royal throne over Israel forever..." God does not build His kingdom on human abilities, personalities, and wisdom, but on the truth of His word, through His people who impact others through their integrity and faithfulness.

To live such a life is to commit ourselves first to God, and then to one another in accountable relationships. It's to learn from our mistakes and to be open to correction and change. It's to put our faith into action so that others too can be inspired and led to the Lord Jesus we follow.

- Why do you think Israel was moved to contribute? How does this link to our giving of time, effort, and money today?

Prayer Points

- Give thanks that all of us have been given the privilege of participating in bringing each other closer to Christ.
- Pray for discernment as Session meets this week to appoint a multi-disciplinary team for our A&A project.
- Pray for our pastors, elders, deacons, and ministry leaders as planning meetings for 2025 Workplan are ongoing. Pray for the Holy Spirit's leading, wisdom, openness, and creativity as they consider what ministry will look like when we go off-site.



1) Launch of Fund–Raising Efforts:

Fund-Raising Targets

Our total fund-raising target for ORPC is approximately \$23 million. Fund-raising efforts will be focused on raising at least \$10 million, with the remainder being funded by our existing reserves (\$13 million). Raising more than \$10 million will help us to offset potential unexpected expenses and reduce the draw-down effect on our reserves, allowing us to be in a better financial position when we complete the project. Through various fund-raising initiatives which will be announced in the future, ORPC English will be targeting to raise at least \$8.5 million, and ORPC Indonesian will be targeting to raise at least \$1.5 million.

Our fund-raising progress will also be reported in our weekly bulletin from 11th Aug 2024 onwards.



2) Design and Technical Work:

We have successfully conducted a design competition in June and all 5 architect firms invited to participate have submitted their proposal as of 28th June 2024. An 11-member jury panel consisting of Pastoral staff, leaders of ORPC and PPC, and members of the A&A Technical Team evaluated the various proposals and forwarded their findings to the Session for final decision.

The Session will decide on the concept design to be adopted and on the appointment of the architectural firm to move forward in preparing a full study and design for Session's final approval.



3) Restoration of our Pipe Organ

The Session has also discussed the idea of refurbishment of the Pipe organ in conjunction with the A&A works. The Pipe organ was last worked on in 1962 and is now in urgent need of repairs and upgrading. We are working with our consultants and professional organ builders/maintainers on the technical details of this work.

Initial quotations received for this work are on the order of about \$1.3 million.

4) Relocation of Worship Services

The Session is exploring the possibility of deferring the relocation of worship services to 1^{st} October 2025 (instead of 1^{st} July 2025) to provide more time for the technical and the logistics team to work on the details of this project.

We have been studying the possibilities of several Presbyterian churches who can accommodate us on Sunday afternoon, alongside a number of potential sites offered by commercial operators. With many changes to adjust to, our primary criteria is for the relocation site to be able to meet our capacity requirements and retain respective worship service timings, to ensure continuity and a sense of consistency for our members. Other key criterions are the accessibility of the site by public transport as well as car parking spaces.

We will be working on this as well as the relocation of the Admin/Pastoral offices and hope to be able to confirm these arrangements within the next 2-3 months.

Note from Rev Clive Chin, Senior Minister

Dear friends of ORPC, after many years of deliberation, it looks like we are finally ready to embark upon the A&A project. Starting on 1st October 2025, our church will have to relocate to another venue to hold worship services for a couple of years. As we anticipate some disruption to our ministries, we ask for your continued prayers. I pray that the gospel—the power of God—that brought salvation to everyone who believes in Jesus may continue to give us grateful hearts to support the ministry of ORPC.

What is a pledge?

HISTORY

The Orchard Road Presbyterian Church (ORPC) was founded in 1856 to minister to the needs of the Scots community in Singapore. The first church building on the present site was completed in 1878, and has been extended several times. In 1975, the sanctuary was extended, and in 1985, the new extension of Dunman Hall was completed and a new chapel was built. Alongside the growth of the physical facilities has been the development of the church from an Englishspeaking expatriate congregation to a local church embracing four different language congregations. In 1995 we planted a branch church (Bukit Batok Presbyterian Church) which became independent in 2013. Similarly, our Mandarin congregation (Providence Presbyterian Church) became independent in 2005. ORPC consists of the English Congregation and the Indonesian Congregation, and worshipping with us now in the same building are Providence Presbyterian Church, and the German-speaking Protestant Congregation in Singapore.

FAITH AND MEMBERSHIP

As a church with roots in historic Presbyterianism growing out of the Westminster Confession of Faith, we affirm the Lordship of our Saviour, Jesus Christ. We look to the Scriptures as the inspired Word of God and the one authoritative and infallible standard for our faith and practice. We welcome those who profess Jesus Christ as their personal Lord and Saviour into our formal membership. Our membership is truly international, representing the breadth of God's call upon people from all ethnic and economic backgrounds. Members are received upon initial profession of faith in Jesus Christ by baptism, confirmation, and in transfer from other Christian churches. Classes for baptism, confirmation, and for transfer of membership are held periodically and announced in the bulletin.

THE APOSTLES' CREED

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the grave. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty. He will come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.
