<sup>1</sup> Moses assembled the whole Israelite community and said to them, “These are the things the Lord has commanded you to do: <sup>2</sup>For six days, work is to be done, but the seventh day shall be your holy day, a day of sabbath rest to the Lord. Whoever does any work on it is to be put to death. <sup>3</sup>Do not light a fire in any of your dwellings on the Sabbath day.”

<sup>4</sup> Moses said to the whole Israelite community, “This is what the Lord has commanded: <sup>5</sup>From what you have, take an offering for the Lord. Everyone who is willing is to bring to the Lord an offering of gold, silver and bronze; <sup>6</sup>blue, purple and scarlet yarn and fine linen; goat hair; <sup>7</sup>ram skins dyed red and another type of durable leather; acacia wood; <sup>8</sup>olive oil for the light; spices for the anointing oil and for the fragrant incense; <sup>9</sup>and onyx stones and other gems to be mounted on the ephod and breastpiece.

<sup>10</sup> “All who are skilled among you are to come and make everything the Lord has commanded: <sup>11</sup>the tabernacle with its tent and its covering, clasps, frames, crossbars, posts and bases; <sup>12</sup>the ark with its poles and the atonement cover and the curtain that shields it; <sup>13</sup>the table with its poles and all its articles and the bread of the Presence; <sup>14</sup>the lampstand that is for light with its accessories, lamps and oil for the light; <sup>15</sup>the altar of incense with its poles, the anointing oil and the fragrant incense; the curtain for the doorway at the entrance to the tabernacle; <sup>16</sup>the altar of burnt offering with its bronze grating, its poles and all its utensils; the bronze basin with its stand; <sup>17</sup>the curtains of the courtyard with its posts and bases, and the curtain for the entrance to the courtyard; <sup>18</sup>the tent pegs for the tabernacle and for the courtyard, and their ropes; <sup>19</sup>the woven garments worn for ministering in the sanctuary—both the sacred garments for Aaron the priest and the garments for his sons when they serve as priests.”

<sup>20</sup> Then the whole Israelite community withdrew from Moses' presence, <sup>21</sup> and everyone who was willing and whose heart moved them came and brought an offering to the Lord for the work on the tent of meeting, for all its service, and for the sacred garments. <sup>22</sup> All who were willing, men and women alike, came and brought gold jewelry of all kinds: brooches, earrings, rings and ornaments. They all presented their gold as a wave offering to the Lord. <sup>23</sup> Everyone who had blue, purple or scarlet yarn or fine linen, or goat hair, ram skins dyed red or the other durable leather brought them. <sup>24</sup> Those presenting an offering of silver or bronze brought it as an offering to the Lord, and everyone who had acacia wood for any part of the work brought it. <sup>25</sup> Every skilled woman spun with her hands and brought what she had spun—blue, purple or scarlet yarn or fine linen. <sup>26</sup> And all the women who were willing and had the skill spun the goat hair. <sup>27</sup> The leaders brought onyx stones and other gems to be mounted on the ephod and breastpiece. <sup>28</sup> They also brought spices and olive oil for the light and for the anointing oil and for the fragrant incense. <sup>29</sup> All the Israelite men and women who were willing brought to the Lord freewill offerings for all the work the Lord through Moses had commanded them to do.

<sup>30</sup> Then Moses said to the Israelites, "See, the Lord has chosen Bezalel son of Uri, the son of Hur, of the tribe of Judah, <sup>31</sup> and he has filled him with the Spirit of God, with wisdom, with understanding, with knowledge and with all kinds of skills— <sup>32</sup> to make artistic designs for work in gold, silver and bronze, <sup>33</sup> to cut and set stones, to work in wood and to engage in all kinds of artistic crafts. <sup>34</sup> And he has given both him and Oholiab son of Ahisamak, of the tribe of Dan, the ability to teach others. <sup>35</sup> He has filled them with skill to do all kinds of work as engravers, designers, embroiderers in blue, purple and scarlet yarn and fine linen, and weavers—all of them skilled workers and designers.

## How may we safeguard ourselves from dishonesty?

Honesty is not merely a social virtue but a reflection of one's character and relationship with God. It is one of the marks of a true follower of Christ. As the apostle Paul said, those who have been raised to new life with Christ must "put to death the sinful, earthly things lurking within you... get rid of anger, rage, malicious behaviour, slander and dirty language... don't lie to each other...put on your new nature and be renewed as you learn to know your Creator and become like Him" (Colossians 3:5-10). Christians are expected to embody honesty in their daily lives, reinforcing the idea that integrity is integral to their faith (Proverbs 12:22).

This is challenging as the practices of dishonesty in today's society are subtle. Everyone does it. It is for survival. We justify using harmless, white lies to avoid hurting someone's feelings. We stretch the truth. We keep silent about the truth. We exaggerate. We gossip. We give more credit to ourselves at the expense of our colleagues. Our actions pale in comparison to our words.

Although dishonesty might be the norm, Christians can safeguard ourselves from dishonesty. How?

- (1) Draw close to God. The Word of God provides us with timeless wisdom and guidance on how to live a life of righteousness and honesty (James 1:22).
- (2) Strive to please God and not people (1 Thessalonians 2:4-10). Prioritize honesty as a core value in our interactions with others.
- (3) Practice self-awareness. Identify the underlying motivations behind our dishonesty and ask God to change us (Psalm 139:23-24).
- (4) Practice honesty in all aspects of our lives (Romans 12:2, 13:6-7, Colossians 3:23-25). Let your actions speak louder than your words.
- (5) Speak the truth in love (Ephesians 4:29). Ask God to give you wisdom and grace and commit to prayers.
- (6) Develop strong communication skills to help navigate difficult situations without resorting to dishonesty (James 3:8-10).
- (7) Be humble. When you have wronged someone, confess your sins and pray for each other (James 5:16).
- (8) Find a small group. Surround yourself with a community of like-minded believers who encourage and hold each other accountable (Proverbs 27:17).

Safeguarding ourselves from dishonesty requires a conscious effort to align our thoughts, words, and actions with God's truth. By seeking His guidance through prayer, studying His Word, and cultivating authentic relationships with fellow believers, we can strive to walk in integrity and uphold the Christian character that is pleasing to God.

**Read Exodus 36:1-8**

- What was the attitude of the Israelites towards the building of the Tabernacle?
- Consider the attitude of the Israelites in light of the events of Exodus 32-34. What does this tell you about their commitment to the covenant with God now?

**Prayer Points**

- Pray for each of us to be re-convicted of the gospel and the new covenant.
- Pray for our pastors, elders, deacons, and ministry leaders as planning meetings for 2025 Workplan are ongoing. Pray for the Holy Spirit’s leading, wisdom, openness, and creativity as they consider what ministry will look like when we go off-site.
- Pray for the seniors at Sarah and Evergreen AAC as they celebrate birthdays in these two weeks – pray for them to know the joy of the gospel and the peace of the new covenant.

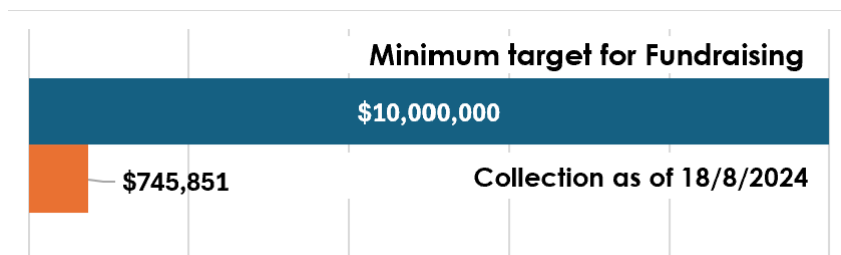

## HISTORY

The Orchard Road Presbyterian Church (ORPC) was founded in 1856 to minister to the needs of the Scots community in Singapore. The first church building on the present site was completed in 1878, and has been extended several times. In 1975, the sanctuary was extended, and in 1985, the new extension of Dunman Hall was completed and a new chapel was built. Alongside the growth of the physical facilities has been the development of the church from an English-speaking expatriate congregation to a local church embracing four different language congregations. In 1995 we planted a branch church (Bukit Batok Presbyterian Church) which became independent in 2013. Similarly, our Mandarin congregation (Providence Presbyterian Church) became independent in 2005. ORPC consists of the English Congregation and the Indonesian Congregation, and worshipping with us now in the same building are Providence Presbyterian Church, and the German-speaking Protestant Congregation in Singapore.

## FAITH AND MEMBERSHIP

As a church with roots in historic Presbyterianism growing out of the Westminster Confession of Faith, we affirm the Lordship of our Saviour, Jesus Christ. We look to the Scriptures as the inspired Word of God and the one authoritative and infallible standard for our faith and practice. We welcome those who profess Jesus Christ as their personal Lord and Saviour into our formal membership. Our membership is truly international, representing the breadth of God's call upon people from all ethnic and economic backgrounds. Members are received upon initial profession of faith in Jesus Christ by baptism, confirmation, and in transfer from other Christian churches. Classes for baptism, confirmation, and for transfer of membership are held periodically and announced in the bulletin.

## THE APOSTLES' CREED

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the grave. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.
