



Seventy-Seven Times?

Have you often been perplexed by some of Jesus' sayings in the gospels? I must admit that there are many times I scratched my head over what Jesus said in response to the different questions his disciples and his opponents posed him.

One of them is in Matthew 18. In verse 21, Peter asked Jesus, "Lord, how many times shall I forgive my brother or sister who sins against me? Up to seven times?" When Jesus answered, "not seven times, but seventy-seven times," his Jewish audience would immediately have caught a reference that made them smile at his brilliance.

You see, Jesus was using an ancient Jewish teaching technique called 'remez' which means 'hint' or 'clue'. 'Remez' was the art of teaching through hints. Rabbis would quote a part of scripture and let their audience fill in the blank, to deduce the lesson themselves. When Jesus used the number "seventy-seven times," his Jewish listeners would have immediately thought of the only other place that number appeared in their scriptures—the story of Lamech.

Genesis 4:23-24 records, "Lamech said to his wives, 'Adah and Zillah, listen to me; wives of Lamech, hear my words. I have killed a man for wounding me, a young man for injuring me. If Cain is avenged seven times, then Lamech seventy-seven times.'" You see, God had earlier put a mark on Cain to protect him and proclaimed, "anyone who kills Cain will suffer vengeance seven times over" (Gen 4:15).

Where Lamech's vengeful words boasted a revenge greater than God's mercy for undeserving sinners, Jesus turns us back to God's amazing offer of unlimited grace that his followers are to extend to others, having our own debts cancelled by the King (Matt 18:27).

The points Jesus was making are clear: (1) there is no one who can forgive more than he needs to be forgiven (our seven times and God's seventy-seven times) and (2) Jesus' followers let God's mercy fill them so when revenge tempts us, God's mercy overflows through our forgiveness for those who sins against us. Let us examine where we have been hurt. Where hatred multiplied, may forgiveness overflow; where hurt deepens, may God's grace grow.

Read 1 John 3:11-24

- How does the story of Cain and Abel apply to our relationships with our brothers- and sisters-in-Christ today (vv.11-17)?
- How can we express our love for one another practically (v.18)?
- How does our knowing that God is greater than our hearts comfort us in times of guilt or self-doubt (vv.19-24)?

Prayer Points

- Pray for the safety of workers and a smooth renovation process at the YWCA office site as we prepare the place for our pastoral and administrative staff.
- Pray for Christian parents whose children are living outside of God's will. Their burden is heavy; pray for fellow believers and the church to come alongside them to encourage and journey with them.
- Pray for our youths and young adults starting out this new year at school or the workplace that they will seek and rely on God's strength and wisdom in their journey ahead.





Latest updates on ORPC Alteration & Additions (A&A) Project February 2025

Building a Disciple Making Church Our Legacy of Faith for Future Generations

1. Changes to Worship Service

Though we move out only in October, we have begun making changes to how we do Sunday worship. This is so that we don't get surprised when we move out and we get a chance to try and refine our changes before we go to Suntec.

Children's Ministry

The first major change is in the Children's Ministry. From 5 January 2025, the children have started on a re-structured format for Sunday School. Both the children and teachers are taking some time to get used to this new format before introducing further changes.



Information Dissemination

Our weekly bulletin & announcements are being sent out through the WhatsApp broadcast. This will help us when we move to soft copy bulletins in July.

Upcoming Changes

In May, we will be updating our bulletin format to support soft copy dissemination. Our website format will also be updated for easier reading.

In July, we will be moving to electronic transfers only for our offerings and soft copy bulletins.

2. Off-site Locations

The contract with YWCA Outram (where our pastoral and administrative offices will be located) has been signed. Basic renovations are beginning in preparation for our offices to move in June.



3. Sunday Services in Suntec

Our morning and evening services will continue while we are in Suntec. Set up begins at about 7AM and teardown ends at about 7.30PM each Sunday.

4. Fundraising Recap and Updates

The fund-raising target for ORPC is **\$23 million**. Fundraising efforts will be focused on raising \$10 million, with the remainder of \$13 million being funded by our existing reserves. Raising more than \$10 million will help us to offset potential unexpected expenses and reduce the draw-down effect on our reserves.

HISTORY

The Orchard Road Presbyterian Church (ORPC) was founded in 1856 to minister to the needs of the Scots community in Singapore. The first church building on the present site was completed in 1878, and has been extended several times. In 1975, the sanctuary was extended, and in 1985, the new extension of Dunman Hall was completed and a new chapel was built. Alongside the growth of the physical facilities has been the development of the church from an English-speaking expatriate congregation to a local church embracing four different language congregations. In 1995 we planted a branch church (Bukit Batok Presbyterian Church) which became independent in 2013. Similarly, our Mandarin congregation (Providence Presbyterian Church) became independent in 2005. ORPC consists of the English Congregation and the Indonesian Congregation, and worshipping with us now in the same building are Providence Presbyterian Church, and the German-speaking Protestant Congregation in Singapore.

FAITH AND MEMBERSHIP

As a church with roots in historic Presbyterianism growing out of the Westminster Confession of Faith, we affirm the Lordship of our Saviour, Jesus Christ. We look to the Scriptures as the inspired Word of God and the one authoritative and infallible standard for our faith and practice. We welcome those who profess Jesus Christ as their personal Lord and Saviour into our formal membership. Our membership is truly international, representing the breadth of God's call upon people from all ethnic and economic backgrounds. Members are received upon initial profession of faith in Jesus Christ by baptism, confirmation, and in transfer from other Christian churches. Classes for baptism, confirmation, and for transfer of membership are held periodically and announced in the bulletin.

THE APOSTLES' CREED

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the grave. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.
