To Change, Or Not To Change?

I've been thinking about change recently. When is it necessary, and when is it not? How do we know? A few common phrases came to mind: "if it's not broken, don't fix it", "a stitch in time saves nine", "the best time to fix a roof is when the sun is shining". These seem to offer different perspectives. First: to wait until a problem is truly a problem before changing things; second: to pre-empt the problem so that the change is less painful; third: change things on your schedule since it's unlikely that it will be convenient for you when the change is eventually really needed.

We know that all these perspectives on change are valid, but at different times and situations. Right now, while we are on the cusp of a major change, I find myself contemplating this question in greater depth. Should we change what we do, should we change how we do things?

In truth, I am myself somewhat conflicted. After all, what we do and how we do it seems to have worked for us in the past, is change necessary? But we will not be in the same place, we will not have the same physical resources, and even our human resources will be somewhat strained as we focus on caring for a more scattered congregation while we are out – can we really afford to keep doing the same things in the same way? So change will happen. Yet as these changes happen, it's important for us to know that the changes are a response to changing circumstances, not a statement that the "old" way is broken. These changes are done ahead of time because the changing circumstances are already known, and it is better for us to be able to plan out the changes, think through them, and implement them on our schedule. That's why you see changes happening from January rather than only in October when we really move out.

And even more importantly, we also must remember that change is not the enemy. The world around us continues to change at a rapid pace. The way we do things, the ministry we offer to the world around us must change because the world changes. But what has not changed and what will never change is Who we point to, and why we point to Him. We cannot confuse the specific tasks we do with the general task we have been given – to make disciples, baptising them and teaching them to obey God. This we must do and continue to do, but how we do it will change and keep changing. May God always give us the wisdom to discern how He has called us to fulfill His Great Commission.

Read Psalm 2

- What is the significance of the nations and their rulers' resistance, and how does God respond to their defiance?
- How does this passage point to the divine authority and kingship of the Messiah, and what role does this play in God's ultimate plan?
- In Psalm 2:10-12, the psalmist offers counsel to kings and rulers. What is the message for earthly authorities, and how does the call to serve in gladness before God reflects God's sovereignty?

Prayer Points

- Pray for reflective hearts and spiritual renewal as we approach Good Friday and Easter.
- Pray for a fair Singapore general election and discernment for Singaporeans to elect its government.
- Pray for the people of Myanmar and Thailand affected by the earthquake that struck on 28 March.

Dear ORPC member,

Extraordinary Congregational Meeting (ECM) on Sunday, 25 May 2025, for Amendments to the ORPC Constitution

I am writing to urge you to attend our Extraordinary Congregational Meeting (ECM) on Sunday, 25 May 2025 immediately following the AM and PM services.

In that meeting, we will ask you to consider and pass the following resolutions to amend our church constitution.

- 1. To state the biblical teaching on marriage as limited to a union between a man and a woman.
- 2. To clarify that "the Elders and Deacons Court" also be recognised as the "Board of Management."
- 3. To remove the term "serving" Elders and/or Deacons to represent ORPC to the general meetings of the relevant Presbytery and the Synod.
- 4. To allow for hybrid or virtual meetings so as to avoid physical or inperson meetings in case of the imposition of national health measures.

Your participation is critical because we require a quorum of 50% of the total membership in order to amend the church constitution. Please mark your calendar and plan to join the meeting. May the Lord also grant you wisdom to consider these important amendments to the church constitution.

NOMINATION & ELECTION OF ELDERS AND DEACONS

Session is calling for an Extraordinary Congregational Meeting (ECM) for the election of Elders and Deacons to be held on **Sunday, 25 May 2025**. Those elected will serve a three-year term from 1 July 2025.

ORPC members are entitled to nominate other ORPC members who have been serving faithfully in ORPC and demonstrated leadership qualities, for election as Elders or Deacons.

The closing date for nominations is **Sunday**, **6 April 2025**.

Session will interview all candidates with their spouses (if any). Those who qualify and are deemed to be suitable nominees will be recommended and announced to the congregation on three Sundays (4, 11, 18 May 2025) prior to the election date.

To be duly elected, candidates must receive at least (a) two-thirds of the votes cast for Elders and (b) half of the votes cast for Deacons.

WHAT DO ELDERS AND DEACONS DO?

Elders and Deacons are voluntary office bearers in the Congregation. They join the pastoral staff in pastoral leadership and oversight, oversee the management of ORPC, assist in the administration of ORPC and in all matters concerning the building-up and growth of ORPC.

Elders serve primarily in Session and may also be appointed to the Board of Management (BoM). Session is the final decision-making body in ORPC and has particular responsibility for the spiritual mission and growth of ORPC.

Deacons serve in the BoM and have particular responsibility for the pastoral care of God's people and for managing the material resources of ORPC to serve its spiritual mission.

WHO CAN BE NOMINATED AND ELECTED?

- Elders and Deacons must meet the biblical qualifications according to 1 Timothy 3:1-13 and Titus 1:6-9.
- Nominees must be communicant members of ORPC for more than three years.
- All nominees are expected to have served in at least one area of ministry in ORPC for a minimum period of one year prior to being nominated.
- Elders must have served for at least one term of three years as a Deacon.
- Spouses of Elders and Deacons must also be communicant members of ORPC.
 Divorcees and those with previously-divorced spouses do not qualify for nomination.

- Elders and Deacons must assent to the basic creeds and confessions of the Presbyterian Church, the Apostles' Creed, the Westminster Confession of Faith, the Constitution of the Synod of the Presbyterian Church in Singapore and the Constitution of ORPC.
- Elders and Deacons must assent to and carry out the vision and mission of ORPC to do Disciple-Making Church.
- Elders and Deacons are expected to be regular in attendance at worship, leadership and congregational meetings e.g. Session/Board of Management meetings, life-stage / ministry / committee meetings as assigned, Leaders Onboarding, Leaders' Equipping & Training, Leaders Retreat, Annual / Extraordinary congregational meetings. They will also undertake other duties relevant to their office and other assigned responsibilities as decided from time to time.
- Nominees must not be or have been disqualified to be a member of the Board of Management or Session by virtue of the Charities Act, chapter 37 of Singapore, or any other statute, law or regulation.

HOW TO NOMINATE?

Elders and Deacons must be proposed and seconded by other communicant members of ORPC.

A member who wants to nominate another member should first check the eligibility of that other member (please see above) before making any nomination.

The proposer needs a seconder for the nomination. After both the proposer and the seconder have signed the nomination form, the nominee must sign the form to confirm his/her consent to the nomination.

PRESBYTERIAN PRIMARY SCHOOLS — P1 PHASE 2B REGISTRATION

ORPC members who wish to register their children in Kuo Chuan Presbyterian Primary School (Bishan) or Pei Hwa Presbyterian Primary School (Bukit Timah) at Phase 2B for admission to Primary One in January 2026 are to request for the Letter of Eligibility ("Form B"), before Monday, 5 May 2025, from the church office via email to orpcenglish@orpc.org.sg stating (a) full names of both parents of the child, (b) at least one contact number, (c) which ministry in ORPC that parent(s) is/are serving and (d) from when the parent(s) has/have been serving.

The eligibility for *priority* in P1 registration under Phase 2B is guided by the following conditions:

- 1. Child is either a Singapore Citizen or a Singapore Permanent Resident.
- At least one parent being an active communicant member of ORPC. An 'active communicant member' here refers to a baptised church member who has volunteered at least one year of service to ORPC i.e. has been serving on or before 1 June 2024.
- 3. If the number of applicants exceed the number of vacancies in the school, places will be balloted according to the following order of priority:
 - a) Singapore Citizens will be given priority over Singapore Permanent Residents, before home-school distance is considered.
 - b) Children living within 1km of the school.
 - c) Children living between 1km and 2km of the school.
 - d) Children living outside 2km of the school.

 Applicants may check the home-school distance via this link: https://www.onemap.gov.sg/#/SchoolQueryInfo
- Parents are to submit hardcopies of the following to the church office, latest, by Monday, 5 May 2025:
 - i. 'Letter of Eligibility' ("Form B") with Section A completed;
 - ii. Photocopy of Child's birth certificate/Citizenship certificate/PR document;
 - iii. Photocopy of both parents' NRIC
 - iv. Photocopy of Child's immunisation certificate.
- The Letter of Eligibility issued by the Church gives the applicant priority in registration in an earlier Phase, namely Phase 2B, but does not guarantee a place in the school.

- Important: Parents will still need to complete an online registration (MOE's) under Phase 2B national registration exercise in July 2025. Do watch out for MOE's registration dates and the documents that would be required.



HISTORY

The Orchard Road Presbyterian Church (ORPC) was founded in 1856 to minister to the needs of the Scots community in Singapore. The first church building on the present site was completed in 1878, and has been extended several times. In 1975, the sanctuary was extended, and in 1985, the new extension of Dunman Hall was completed and a new chapel was built. Alongside the growth of the physical facilities has been the development of the church from an English-speaking expatriate congregation to a local church embracing four different language congregations. In 1995 we planted a branch church (Bukit Batok Presbyterian Church) which became independent in 2013. Similarly, our Mandarin congregation (Providence Presbyterian Church) became independent in 2005. ORPC consists of the English Congregation and the Indonesian Congregation, and worshipping with us now in the same building are Providence Presbyterian Church, and the German-speaking Protestant Congregation in Singapore.

FAITH AND MEMBERSHIP

As a church with roots in historic Presbyterianism growing out of the Westminster Confession of Faith, we affirm the Lordship of our Saviour, Jesus Christ. We look to the Scriptures as the inspired Word of God and the one authoritative and infallible standard for our faith and practice. We welcome those who profess Jesus Christ as their personal Lord and Saviour into our formal membership. Our membership is truly international, representing the breadth of God's call upon people from all ethnic and economic backgrounds. Members are received upon initial profession of faith in Jesus Christ by baptism, confirmation, and in transfer from other Christian churches. Classes for baptism, confirmation, and for transfer of membership are held periodically and announced in the bulletin.

THE APOSTLES' CREED

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the grave. On the third day he rose again.
