Into Your Hands

At the very end of His life, Jesus said, "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit" (Luke 23:46). This statement is quoted by Jesus from Psalm 31 verse 5a, "Into your hands I commit my spirit." King David was often in trouble. This verse reflects deep and personal trust in God amid the depths of difficulty.

Jesus entrusted His life completely to His Heavenly Father, even when He was facing a gruesome death on the cross. That is why we too can fully trust in God's grace no matter what happens in our life, even when we cannot fully understand it. We can entrust our life to our Heavenly Father, to whom Jesus also entrusted His life to.

The apostle Peter encourages believers, "So then those who suffer according to God's will should commit themselves to their faithful Creator and continue to do good" (1 Peter 4:19). The COVID-19 pandemic shows us that our hands cannot control everything, including our life. Only to God's hands can we entrust everything to, including our life. Jesus entrusted His life to His Father and the result is eternal life for you and me.

The Orchard Road Presbyterian Church (ORPC) was founded in 1856 to minister to the needs of the Scots community in Singapore. The first church building on the present site was completed in 1878, and has been extended several times. In 1975, the sanctuary was extended, and in 1985, the new extension of Dunman Hall was completed and a new chapel was built. Alongside the growth of the physical facilities has been the development of the church from an English-speaking expatriate congregation to a local church embracing four different language congregations. In 1995 we planted a branch church (Bukit Batok Presbyterian Church) which became independent in 2013. Similarly, our Mandarin congregation (Providence Presbyterian Church) became independent in 2005. ORPC consists of the English Congregation and the Indonesian Congregation, and worshipping with us now in the same building are Providence Presbyterian Church, and the German-speaking Protestant Congregation in Singapore.

FAITH AND MEMBERSHIP

As a church with roots in historic Presbyterianism growing out of the Westminster Confession of Faith, we affirm the Lordship of our Saviour, Jesus Christ. We look to the Scriptures as the inspired Word of God and the one authoritative and infallible standard for our faith and practice. We welcome those who profess Jesus Christ as their personal Lord and Saviour into our formal membership. Our membership is truly international, representing the breadth of God's call upon people from all ethnic and economic backgrounds. Members are received upon initial profession of faith in Jesus Christ by baptism, confirmation, and in transfer from other Christian churches. Classes for baptism, confirmation, and for transfer of membership are held periodically and announced in the bulletin.

THE APOSTLES' CREED

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the grave. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty. He will come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.
