Latest updates on ORPC Alteration & Additions (A&A) Project May 2025

Building a Disciple Making Church Our Legacy of Faith for Future Generations

1. Changes to Worship Service

Changes to the main service will be happening in phases. The first phase begins today with our service bulletin reduced in length for easier readability on your devices, in preparation for moving it to online-only access. This has been made possible because our website has been revamped as of 1 May. Thank you to the IT Committee and our Asst IT Manager Nelson Wee for putting in the hard work to streamline and update the information on our website to enable this change.

In July, the next phase will kick-in where services will be modelled exactly to how it will be conducted at Suntec, introducing only electronic transfers for bulletins, our new worship format without the choir, and with electronic instruments. This allows us time to get used to new ways of doing things, to iron out any kinks, and to get feedback before our actual move.

2. Off-site Locations

YWCA Outram renovations are complete as of end-April.







From May to June, we will be working on the IT installations and beginning to move items over. Packing has begun across all ministries (and staff), with the bulk of it targeted to complete by end June.

We are also currently finalising our contract with Suntec.

While our efforts are focused on raising \$10 million, with the remainder of \$13 million being funded by our existing reserves, raising more than \$10 million will



help us to offset potential unexpected expenses and reduce the draw-down effect on our reserves.

Sale of Holland Grove Property

We thank God for the sale of the Holland Grove property at \$10 million. The buyer has exercised the option to purchase and the sale is confirmed. The funds raised by this go towards the overall funds (rather than towards funds raised by any one congregation)

4. Technical Updates

As announced in September 2024, session has approved the appointment of **Messrs Formwerkz Architects LLP** (also known as the Multi-Disciplinary Team, MDT) to undertake the full design and management of the project, including making the necessary submissions to the relevant authorities for the A&A project.

Investigative Works

The Multi-Disciplinary Team (MDT) has completed a number of tests:

- Asbestos survey works
- Topographical survey works
- Geometric survey works
- Underground services detection works

Soil investigation works are currently ongoing and are on track to be completed by May 2025.

Government Information and Applications

Baseline information from the Singapore Land Authority was received in March.



Concurrently, pre-consultations with various government agencies are ongoing. Inprinciple approval has been obtained from LTA for the Pick-Up/Drop-Off (PUDO) access from Fort Canning Road. Application to URA for planning permission is also in progress.

Building and Construction

We are looking into the tender for the main contractor to conduct construction works for our building site. Pre-qualification for the main tender is ongoing. The main tender is expected to be awarded in 2025Q3.

Initial feedback has also been given to the appointed architects on the building plan.

All Communicant Members are encouraged to attend the ECM so that we can meet the quorum to amend the Constitution.

Appendix 1

RESOLUTION 1A TO AMEND ORPC CONSTITUTION TO INCLUDE NEW ARTICLE 2.4

Background

The Synod Theological Review and Response Committee and the Synod Constitution Committee have set out the biblical principles on gender, sexuality, singlehood and marriage. These principles were accepted at the 2016 Synod AGM and have been approved by the Commissioner of Charities and the Registry of Societies for incorporation in the Constitution of the Presbyterian Church in Singapore and its Member Churches.

To ensure that all Member Churches are aligned on this issue, it was agreed at the Synod AGM that all Member Churches, including ORPC, will incorporate these provisions in their constitutions.

These provisions set out clearly ORPC's biblical position on sexuality, sexual conduct and marriage as well as protect the church by ensuring that all those in teaching and leadership functions uphold this biblical position as well.

None of these provisions negate our Christian response and pastoral care towards all those who struggle with LGBT tendencies. We had supported, and will continue to support, all those who come forward for help.

RESOLUTION 1A TO AMEND ORPC CONSTITUTION BY INSERTING THE FOLLOWING PROVISIONS AS ARTICLE 2.4 IN THE ORPC CONSTITUTION

The ORPC Constitution be amended by inserting the following provisions as Article 2.4 in the ORPC Constitution:

2.4 ORPC also declares as follows:

There has been increasing confusion and distortion of human sexuality in our society. As such, alternative lifestyles and sexual conduct that are contrary to Biblical teaching have been gradually gaining acceptance in our society and the Church must watch against the tolerance and acceptance of such practices within the Church. The Church, as instructed by Scriptures, uphold the following truths:

- (1) That humanity has been created in the image of God, as male and female, to the exclusion of all other (Genesis 1:26 28);
- (2) A substantive expression of the image of God is the marriage institution, defined clearly and uniquely as a lifelong monogamous and exclusive union between one man and one woman (Genesis 2:15-24);
- (3) That any form of sexual expression before and outside marriage is forbidden and is reckoned as sin (1 Corinthians 6:9-20);
- (4) That all Ministers and Preachers and those applying to be appointed as Ministers or Preachers must adhere to, practise and promote these biblical teachings on sexuality and marriage.
- (5) That Ministers and Preachers, together with their Session, shall ensure that all ministry leaders must adhere to, practise and promote these biblical teachings on sexuality, sexual conduct and marriage;
- (6) That Ministers and Preachers, together with their Session, shall exhort their congregants to adhere to and practise the biblical teaching on sexuality, sexual conduct and marriage as faithful witnesses of Christ.
- (7) That all forms of sexual misconduct dishonors God and should not be condone but be dealt with through Church discipline at its respective levels.

[Note: The amendment in Resolution 1A, is to incorporate and give effect to the recommendation by Synod with regards to the issue of sexuality.]

RESOLUTION 1B TO AMEND ORPC CONSTITUTION BY AMENDING THE HEADINGS IN ARTICLE 2, ARTICLE 7.4 AND ARTICLES 8, 8.1 OF THE ORPC CONSTITUTION

Article 2 to insert 'AND ADHERENCE TO BIBLICAL PRINCIPLES' to read as:
2. STATEMENT OF FAITH AND ADHERENCE TO BIBLICAL PRINCIPLES

Article 7.4 to insert "the Elders and Deacons Court also known as the" to read as:
The Office Bearers of ORPC – The Session and the Elders and Deacons Court also known as the Board of Management

Article 8 and Article 8.1 is consequentially amended to read as follows:

- 8. THE ELDERS AND DEACONS COURT also known as the BOARD OF MANAGEMENT
- **8.1** The Elders and Deacons Court shall function as the Board of Management and shall-

[Notes: Resolution 1B make amendments to headings to reflect the new articles. In respect of the amendment to the heading to Article 2, the amendment is to make reference to the insertion of the biblical principles as recommended by Synod. With respect to Articles 7.4, 8 and 8.1 the amendment makes reference to the Elders and Deacons Court in order to align it with the Synod's Model Constitution which continues to refer to the same. This is to continue to reflect our rich history in which the Elders and Deacons Court was always the name given to the Board of Management committee which included Elders and Deacons.]

RESOLUTION 1C TO REMOVE THE WORD "SERVING" IN ARTICLE 4.2 TO READ IN THE FOLLOWING MANNER:

ORPC shall appoint Representatives, who shall comprise the Senior Minister, ordained Ministers, Preachers, other Pastoral Staff and such number of **serving** Elders and/or Deacons which ORPC is entitled to appoint as set out in the Constitution and by-laws of PCS, to represent it at the general meetings of the relevant Presbytery and the Synod."

[Note: The amendment in Resolution 1C, is to align this Article to the Synod Constitution which has removed the word 'serving'. This will also expand the pool of Elders to be appointed as ORPC Representatives at the general meetings of Synod/Presbytery.]

RESOLUTION 1D TO AMEND ORPC CONSTITUTION TO ALLOW FOR VIRTUAL MEETINGS AND ELECTRONIC VOTING

1. INTRODUCTION

During COVID 19, the Government passed the COVID-19 (Temporary Measures) Act to allow for virtual meetings so as to avoid physical or in-person meetings. When COVID-19 was under control, the Government repealed the Act with effect from 1 July 2023 and amended the Companies Act to allow companies to hold virtual meetings, but did not make similar amendments to the Charities Act or Societies Act. Hence, each charity has to amend its constitution to allow for virtual meetings.

The Synod amended its Constitution by defining the terms "meeting", "present" and "quorum" to mean being present in-person, or virtually, or a combination of in-person and virtual, and the term "vote" to include electronic votes. The mode of conducting a meeting will be decided by the organiser of the meeting. The amendment was passed by the delegates at the Synod AGM on 19 March 2024.

The Synod office has prepared templates based on the amendments made to its Constitution for member Churches to adopt in amending their Constitutions to allow for virtual meetings and electronic voting.

The Session has reviewed the template, received the prior approval of the Commissioner of Charities and has agreed to put forward the template amendments to members to approve. Hybrid or virtual meetings will help promote a spirit of unity and fellowship among congregants and build up church-life, including connecting with those who are homebound.

The Resolution to amend the Constitution is set out in Resolution 1D of this Appendix. Communicant Members are asked to approve this Resolution.

RESOLUTION 1D TO AMEND THE CONSTITUTION BY ADDING NEW DEFINITIONS TO ALLOW FOR VIRTUAL MEETINGS

RESOLVED THAT Article 21 "Definitions" of the Constitution of Orchard Road Presbyterian Church – The Presbyterian Church in Singapore be amended by adding new definitions to the terms "meeting", "present" and "quorum" to allow for virtual meetings, and to the term "vote" to include electronic voting, as highlighted in red print below.

Article 21. **DEFINITIONS**

In this Constitution, unless the context otherwise requires, the following words shall have the meanings ascribed, respectively, to them unless there is something in the subject or context inconsistent with such construction or unless it is therein otherwise expressly provided:

"adherents" means believers who have been regularly worshipping at ORPC but have yet to become members of ORPC;

"Church" means Orchard Road Presbyterian Church – The Presbyterian Church in Singapore;

"Day" means calendar day;

"Family" means a member and his spouse, any of his parents, any of his children or any of his siblings;

"meeting" (including its plural form) means as this word appears in whatever form or context in this Constitution, which includes ACM, ECM and Session meetings, means (i) an in-person meeting held at a physical place; or (ii) a hybrid meeting held at a physical place where, besides those attending in-person, others are allowed to attend and participate virtually using virtual meeting technology provided by the organiser of the meeting; or (iii) a virtual meeting using virtual meeting technology only; with the manner in which the meeting would be conducted decided by the organiser of the meeting and the decision notified in a written notice of meeting to those eligible to attend;

"member" means a person who is 16 years and above and who has been accepted as a member of ORPC in accordance with Articles 5.1 and 5.2;

"Minister" means a Preacher who has been ordained or licensed as a Minister by the relevant Presbytery of PCS, or a Minister who was ordained in another country and has been examined and accepted by PCS to serve as a Minister;

"PCS" means The Presbyterian Church in Singapore;

"Preacher" means a graduate of a recognised theological college who has been recognised as a Preacher by the relevant Presbytery of PCS or such person appointed by Session to its pastoral staff with the local title of "Preacher";

"Presbytery" means a court composed of the representatives of a group of Presbyterian Churches;

"present" means all those present, whether in person or virtually, at the relevant time of the meeting, with the identity of those attending virtually being ascertainable by the organiser of the meeting through the virtual meeting technology;

"quorum" means the minimum number of those present, whether in-person or virtually, required to formally commence a meeting;

"representatives" means those persons described in Article 4.2 appointed by ORPC to represent it at the general meetings of the Presbytery and the Synod;

"Session" means the highest governing body of ORPC comprising the Senior Minister, the ordained Ministers and Serving Elders; and

"Synod" means the highest assembly of PCS attended by all the representatives of the members of PCS.

"vote" includes electronic votes and "voting" includes voting by electronic means. Where voting at a meeting is allowed via electronic means, the electronic voting system that is used must be able to accurately count all votes cast at the meeting, be capable of providing records from which the operation of the electronic voting system may be audited and for the verification of the accuracy of the recording and counting of votes. Each vote that is cast must be verified by ORPC as cast by the member entitled to vote, and the chairman of the meeting must, during the meeting, declare, by electronic means, the result of any matter put to a vote at the meeting.

- 21.2 Words importing the singular shall include the plural, and words in the plural shall include the singular.
- 21.3 Words importing the masculine gender shall include the female, and words importing a person shall include a firm and corporation and vice-versa.

HISTORY

The Orchard Road Presbyterian Church (ORPC) was founded in 1856 to minister to the needs of the Scots community in Singapore. The first church building on the present site was completed in 1878, and has been extended several times. In 1975, the sanctuary was extended, and in 1985, the new extension of Dunman Hall was completed and a new chapel was built. Alongside the growth of the physical facilities has been the development of the church from an English-speaking expatriate congregation to a local church embracing four different language congregations. In 1995 we planted a branch church (Bukit Batok Presbyterian Church) which became independent in 2013. Similarly, our Mandarin congregation (Providence Presbyterian Church) became independent in 2005. ORPC consists of the English Congregation and the Indonesian Congregation, and worshipping with us now in the same building are Providence Presbyterian Church, and the German-speaking Protestant Congregation in Singapore.

FAITH AND MEMBERSHIP

As a church with roots in historic Presbyterianism growing out of the Westminster Confession of Faith, we affirm the Lordship of our Saviour, Jesus Christ. We look to the Scriptures as the inspired Word of God and the one authoritative and infallible standard for our faith and practice. We welcome those who profess Jesus Christ as their personal Lord and Saviour into our formal membership. Our membership is truly international, representing the breadth of God's call upon people from all ethnic and economic backgrounds. Members are received upon initial profession of faith in Jesus Christ by baptism, confirmation, and in transfer from other Christian churches. Classes for baptism, confirmation, and for transfer of membership are held periodically and announced in the bulletin.

THE APOSTLES' CREED

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary.
